AMENDMENT # 001

This amendment, entered between the State of Florida, Department of Health, hereinafter referred to as the "Department" and Pinellas County, hereinafter referred to as the "County", amends the Core Contract for FY 2024-2025.

- 1. The Department and the provider have agreed to amend this contract to reflect funding adjustments received from the Florida Department of Health, to update special project and trust fund balances, planned expenditures, to include lease agreement numbers for each center, and to make other monetary reconciliations as are reflected in the amended attachments as follows:
 - a. Page 2, Core Contract, Section 4. Funding, Paragraph a. i, is hereby amended to change the "amount not to exceed" amount to \$26,253,948.00.
 - b. Page 7, Core Contract, Section 9 b, Miscellaneous, Contract Managers, Mike Davis has been replaced with Jorge Navarrete, email and phone number has been changed to Mr. Navarrete's.
 - c. Attachment II, Part I, Page 1 of 1 is hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached amended Attachment II, Part I, Page 1 of 1.
 - Attachment II, Part II, Pages 1 through 4 are hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached amended Attachment II, part II, Pages 1 through 4.
 - e. Attachment II, Part III, Pages 1 and 2 are hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached revised Attachment II, part III, Pages 1 and 2.
 - f. Attachment V, Special Projects Savings Plan, project number 72252100, St. Petersburg Roof Replacement had expense totaling \$1,070,868.47. Project 72352100 added \$280,000 FCO transfers, Pinellas Clearwater CHD HVAC renovation Pages 1 through 5.
 - g. Attachment A, Schedule C Detail by Appropriation Category, is hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached revised Attachment A, Schedule C Detail by Appropriation Category, pages 1 through 4.
 - h. Attachment B, Reconciliation Between Attachment II, Part II, and Schedule C, is hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached revised Attachment B of the same name; 1 Page.
 - i. Attachment C, Analysis of Fund Equities Report, is hereby added to provide the actual CHD Trust Fund Ending Cash Balance by 9/30/2024 amounts pages 1 through 5.
 - j. Attachments D-O are hereby added to show adjustments in funding through funding memorandums from the department's Schedule C are 41 pages.
- 2. This amendment shall begin on April 1, 2025, or the date on which the amendment has been signed by both parties, whichever is later.

All provisions in the contract and any attachments thereto in conflict with this amendment shall be and are hereby changed to conform with this amendment.

All provisions not in conflict with this amendment are still in effect and are to be performed at the level specified in the contract.

This amendment and all its attachments are hereby made a part of the contract.

those services mandated on a state or federal level. Examples of environmental health services include but are not limited to, food hygiene, safe drinking water supply, sewage, and solid waste disposal, swimming pools, group care facilities, migrant labor camps, toxic material control, radiological health, and occupational health.

b. "Communicable disease control services" are those services that protect the health of the general public through the detection, control, and eradication of diseases that are transmitted primarily by human beings. Communicable disease services shall be supported by available federal, state, and local funds and shall include those services mandated on a state or federal level. Such services include, but are not limited to, epidemiology, sexually transmissible disease detection and control, HIV/AIDS, immunization, tuberculosis control, and maintenance of vital statistics.

c. "Primary care services" are acute care and preventive services that are made available to well and sick persons who are unable to obtain such services due to lack of income or other barriers beyond their control. These services are provided to benefit individuals, improve the collective health of the public, and prevent and control the spread of disease. Primary health care services are provided at home, in group settings, or in clinics. These services shall be supported by available federal, state, and local funds and shall include services mandated on a state or federal level. Examples of primary health care services include but are not limited to first contact acute care services; chronic disease detection and treatment; maternal and child health services; family planning; nutrition; school health; supplemental food assistance for women, infants, and children; home health; and dental services.

4. <u>FUNDING</u>. The parties further agree that funding for the CHD will be handled as follows:

a. The funding to be provided by the parties and any other sources is outlined in Part II of Attachment II hereof. This funding will be used as shown in Part I of Attachment II.

- *i.* The State's appropriated responsibility (direct contribution excluding any state fees, Medicaid contributions, or any other funds not listed on the Schedule C) as provided in Attachment II, Part II is an amount not to exceed <u>\$26,253,948</u> (State General Revenue, State Funds, Other State Funds and Federal Funds listed on the Schedule C). The State's obligation to pay under this contract is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Legislature.
- *ii.* The County's appropriated responsibility (direct contribution excluding any fees, other cash, or local contributions) as provided in Attachment II, Part II is an amount not to exceed \$8,117,320 (amount listed under the "Board of County Commissioners Annual Appropriations section of the revenue attachment).

b. Overall expenditures will not exceed available funding or budget authority, whichever is less, (either the current year or from surplus trust funds) in any service category. Unless requested otherwise, any surplus at the end of the term of this contract in the County Health Department Trust Fund that is attributed to the CHD shall be carried forward to the next contract period.

8. TERMINATION.

a. <u>Termination at Will</u>. This contract may be terminated by either party without cause upon no less than 180 calendar days' notice in writing to the other party unless a lesser time is mutually agreed upon in writing by both parties.

b. <u>Termination Because of Lack of Funds</u>. In the event funds to finance this contract become unavailable, either party may terminate this contract upon no less than 24 hours' notice.

c. <u>Termination for Breach</u>. This contract may be terminated by either party for a material breach of an obligation hereunder, upon no less than 30 days' notice. Waiver of a breach of any provisions of this contract shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other breach and shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of this contract.

9. MISCELLANEOUS. The parties further agree:

a. <u>Availability of Funds</u>. If this contract, any renewal hereof, or any term, performance, or payment hereunder, extends beyond the CHD fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, it is agreed that the performance and payment under this contract are contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Legislature, under section 287.0582, Florida Statutes.

This funding allocation is for the purpose of funding to facilitate evidence-based activities and innovative initiatives to implement educational marketing campaigns to increase awareness of and access to harm reduction resources. CHDs will be selected based on fatal overdose rates and FDOH has allotted more than 30% of the overall prevention budget to ensure statewide coverage. The state project will work closely with individual counties and facilitates meetings and conference calls with all counties to encourage collaboration and information sharing. The Florida Department of Health is an integrated health system with one state health office and 67 county health departments distributed within Florida's 67 counties. There is no contractual relationship and county health departments are not classed as subcontractors as we are one health department.

This grant supports jurisdictions in implementing prevention activities and in collecting accurate, comprehensive, and timely data on nonfatal and fatal overdoses and in using those data to enhance programmatic and surveillance efforts. OD2A focuses on understanding and tracking the complex and changing nature of the drug overdose crisis by seamlessly integrating data and prevention strategies.
