Comments: 6/30/20 Approval of the Agreement with Personal Enrichment Through Mental Health Services, Inc. (PEMHS) for the public mental health Crisis Stabilization Unit (CSU) and the Pinellas Integrated Care Alliance (PICA) pilot program. This Agreement continues funding for the CSU and PICA. The PEMHS CSU is the only licensed public receiving crisis unit in Pinellas County and PICA is an integrated case management pilot that leverages community resources to connect clients to appropriate services. Funding in an amount not to exceed \$2,193,066.00 has been included in the Fiscal Year 2021 Proposed Budget for this purpose. CSU funding not to exceed \$1,693,066.00. PICA funding not to exceed \$500,000.00. Reviewed Agreement, Staff Report and attachments. Similar agreement under 20-1203A. Assigned same insurance limits. Risk is moderate and limits reflect this.

Notes: The PEMHS CSU provides crisis stabilization, psychiatric evaluation, medication management, counseling, and follow up services to clients. PICA is an integrated case management pilot that connects clients to appropriate resources and services to maintain client stability. PEMHS continues to serve Pinellas County 24-hours per day, 7 days per week as the only public Baker Act receiving facility. In Fiscal Year 2019 (FY19) the CSU served 3,303 duplicated clients. PEMHS continues to operate under the Recovery Room Model to place clients in the most appropriate level of care.

In June 2018, Pinellas County coordinated the implementation of PICA to connect clients to critical services to avoid

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the need for crisis stabilization. The Pinellas Integrated Care Team (PIC Team) continues to accept referrals from the Pinellas County Sheriff's Mental Health Unit maintaining a caseload of between 90-100 clients. The PICA Steering Committee made up of Human Services, the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office, Central Florida Behavioral Health Network, and DOH Pinellas, holds monthly meetings to review the program. The Steering Committee discusses PIC Team outcomes and findings to make adjustments on program design and determine next steps to improve the system of care.
