However, I am concerned that the proposed changes reduce meaningful protections for healthy trees, especially on residential properties. While the ordinance technically keeps tree removal permits and mitigation requirements in place, it weakens how those protections work in practice. The proposed changes make it easier to remove healthy trees when removal is tied to development, and trees located within approved building footprints may be removed without replacement. This approach encourages designing projects around tree removal rather than preservation and incentivizes larger building footprints over more creative siting that could retain healthy, mature trees. As a result, the system shifts away from preserving trees and toward removing them with mitigation. That shift is concerning because tree replacement is not the same as tree preservation. A newly planted 2-inch caliper tree does not replace what a mature tree provides. Mature trees absorb stormwater, store carbon, cool neighborhoods through shade, and provide important wildlife habitat. When a healthy, mature tree is removed, those benefits are lost immediately. Replacement trees may take 20 to 40 years to provide similar benefits—if they survive long enough to do so. The ordinance assumes that planting new trees offsets the loss of existing ones, but it does not account for time delays, cumulative canopy loss, or the high mortality rate of newly planted urban trees. As a result, long-term environmental and public health impacts are overlooked. These concerns are especially important as Pinellas County</p>

faces increasing heat, heavier rainfall, and climate stress. Mature trees are one of the most effective tools we have to reduce flooding, protect public health, and strengthen neighborhood resilience. Policies that make it easier to remove them underestimate their true value. I respectfully urge the County to reconsider this approach and strengthen preservation-first protections for healthy, mature trees, especially on residential properties. At a minimum, the ordinance should recognize that replacement trees do not provide the same benefits as the trees that are removed. Thank you for your time and consideration.
