Date/Time/Comments: 5/12/20 Approval and execution by the Board of County Commissioners of grant documents for the Criminal Justice, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse (CJMHSA) Reinvestment Grant. Reviewed DCF Agreement which includes Liability Insurance requirements; however, this does not apply to Pinellas County, as a Political Subdivision of the State of Florida. Agreement is PE to PE and no insurance requirements are required. The Interlocal Agreement with the Public Defender's Office is PE to PE and does not require the assignment of insurance requirements. The MOU requires the Provider, Ready for Life, to provide sufficient Liability Insurance as required by the DCF Agreement. Ready for Life, from their website, provides solution-based skill center supporting youth in homelessness prevention, education & employment, and lifeline support networks. RFL offers a unique Educational Learning Lab program; a full-time Mental Health Counselor, through a partnership with the Pinellas County Public Defender's Office; legal services provided through the Community Law Program, supported by the St. Petersburg Bar Association; Mentor Program; Youth Council; Mommy & Me; Keys to Independence; and more. Confirmed with Human Services that there is no Service Agreement with Ready for Life. The Limits of Insurance shown above are similar to 19-1067D, but also include Cyber. Risk is Moderate and Limits reflect this.

Notes: The CJMHSA Grant will fund the Road to Success (RTS) project, an expansion of the Public Defender's Crossover for Children program. The primary goal of the project is to divert youth in contact with justice and dependency systems from arrest, prosecution, or incarceration and into treatment and support services.

The CJMHSA Reinvestment Grant was created to provide resources for the planning, implementation, or expansion of initiatives that increase public safety and avert future increases in criminal and juvenile justice systems costs. The RTS project will use CJMHSA Reinvestment funds to provide intensive diversion services to 150 clients over 36 months. Eligible clients will include juveniles and young adults who have a mental illness, substance use disorder, or co-

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occurring mental health and substance use disorders, and who are in, or at risk of entering, the criminal or juvenile justice system. The CJMHSA Reinvestment Grant requires oversight by a Planning Committee designated by the Board of County Commissioners (Board). The Public Safety Coordinating Council (PSCC) was designated as the Planning Council by the Board on October 16, 2007 under Agenda Item #18.
