1. Provide a brief narrative as to how the Contractor/Grantee will comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

It is the policy of Pinellas County that in the operation of any federally assisted program, it shall not, on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, religion, or family status, either directly or through contractual means: Deny program services, aids, or benefits; Provide a different service, aid, or benefit, or provide them in a manner different than they are provided to others; or Segregate or separately treat individuals in any matter related to the receipt of any service, aid, or benefit.

Pinellas County further recognizes that in certain circumstances, a failure to ensure that persons with limited English proficiency (LEP) can effectively participate in or benefit from federally assisted programs and activities may result in the denial of program services, aids or benefits. To that end, it is the policy of Pinellas County government to ensure that whenever and wherever possible efforts will be made to ensure that information about the County's programs and services are provided in a manner that is conducive to the full participation of all persons living in this jurisdiction. These efforts shall include, but are not limited to: Identifying county employees who are fluent in languages in addition to English to act as translators whenever this is necessary; Publishing notices and announcements, based on an analysis of Pinellas County Population Demographics from the Bureau of Census, in Spanish and Vietnamese in order to ensure that the two largest groups of individuals who speak a language other than English at home have written access to the information about our programs; and Maintaining the capacity, through the Pinellas County Office of Human Rights, to access to telephonic or video translations of other requested languages, through contracted vendors.
