Description & Comments

Human Service is requesting approval by the Department Director of the grant application and related documents for the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, Student, Teachers, and Officers Preventing (STOP) School Violence Program.

- The County will partner with Pinellas County Schools (PCS) to enhance PCS's Prevention and Mental Health Training Program, aimed to reduce violent crime through the expansion of school safety training resources, mental health programs, and education campaigns for school personnel and students.
- The STOP School Violence Program will provide up to \$999,999 (\$333,333 per year) in federal funding for a 36-month period of performance, from October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2028.
- There is no match or cost sharing requirements. Contract No. 25-0197-RFP in the not-to-exceed total contract amount of \$646,210.60 for a three-year contract, effective October 1, 2025. Authorize the Chairman to sign and the Clerk of the Circuit Court to attest...
- If approved, grant funds of \$333,333 per year will be awarded over a three-year period, totaling \$999,999. There is no required match for this grant. The annual funds will be passed through to Pinellas County Schools, which will serve as the subrecipient responsible for implementing the program. As this grant was unanticipated, it is not included in the FY26 Adopted Budget. Therefore, if approved, a budget amendment will likely be requested to recognize and appropriate the funds into the General Fund.

Fiscal Impact:

If awarded, the STOP School Violence Program will provide up to \$999,999 (\$333,333 per year) in federal funding for a 36-month period, from October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2028. Funding will be passed through to Pinellas County Schools to carry out the program as the subrecipient. There are no match or cost-sharing requirements. The grant award is not included in the FY26 approved budget.
