2018 *a year in review*

Fiscal Year 2018 was a busy one for the Lealman CRA! We are excited to share our progress in this report. Among our biggest accomplishments has been bringing programming to the Lealman Exchange (LEX), a place-based, people-focused project that is taking a collaborative, citizen-centric approach to delivering services and programs aimed at increasing citizen engagement, building broader social networks, developing pathways to employment, improving school readiness and success, and creating a sense of place for all citizens.

Significant progress was also made on the master plan for the Raymond H. Neri Community Park, which was recently re-named after the long time Lealman community advocate who passed away in 2017. The park is adjacent to the LEX and we hope these two projects combined will be a catalyst for redevelopment and anchor this area as the heart of the community for generations to come.

Two other planning projects, Linking Lealman and Living Lealman, also made significant progress in 2018. Research on Linking Lealman, a mobility study incorporating complete streets concepts to enhance safety and boost the level of service for all users, regardless of age, ability or modal choice throughout the Lealman CRA, was completed in 2018, with the final report and further discussion on implementation expected to begin in early 2019.

Living Lealman is a Form-Based Code intended to guide the redevelopment and revitalization efforts into a more cohesive urban form that results in a predictable future development pattern, increased access to goods and services, a mix of housing types, and a high-quality public realm. Public outreach on Living Lealman is expected to begin in 2019.

Finally, we have also been pleased to hear feedback from residents and businesses who have noticed the impact of our CRA neighborhood grants, and we look forward to bringing new CRA grant programs and projects online in Fiscal Year 2019 that will serve the community from within the LEX and throughout the CRA.





Residential and non-residential rehabilitation and demolition grant programs were launched at the beginning of the year. These programs were designed to reduce the costs associated with residential improvements in order to improve existing housing stock, accelerate and leverage private investment as a way to improve the condition and functionality of non-residential buildings, and assist with the removal of substandard structures and blighting, respectively.
