





Sea Turtle Conservancy Retrofit Program

- Organization received funds from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation's Gulf Environmental Benefit Fund (GEBF)
- Replace (retrofit) artificial lights on Florida properties with wildlife friendly alternatives
- Benefits:
 - Protect adult and hatchling sea turtles
 - Save up to 75% in energy costs
 - Help bring beachfront properties into compliance with lighting ordinances
 - Install aesthetically pleasing LED light that also improves night visibility
- We have assisted STC with retrofits at 26 properties in Pinellas County within the last 6 months!
