Human Services is requesting Approval by the Board of County Commissioners of the Public Safety Coordinating Council's (PSCC) Program Recommendation for application to the Florida Department of Children and Families' (DCF) Criminal Justice, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse (CJMHS) Reinvestment Grant Program.

- DCF's CJMHS Reinvestment Grant is provided to enhance or implement programs that promote public safety, avert future justice spending, and improve access to treatment services for justice-involved individuals.
- As required under Chapter 394.657 Florida Statutes (FS), the PSCC, acting as the local Planning Council, shall select a program proposal to be presented to the Board of County Commissioners (Board) for approval. The PSCC will hold a special meeting this week to review and select a program to recommend for approval at the February 17, 2026 Board meeting.
- Upon Board approval, the County may designate an entity to submit the final selected program as a competitive application to DCF by March 19, 2026.
