**NOTES:** This funding opportunity will increase access to mental health, and substance abuse services focusing on the treatment, prevention, and/or awareness of opioid abuse for homeless individuals in Pinellas County. This new award will provide \$82,500.00 (inclusive of a \$10,200.00 increase above our original request of \$75,000.00) in ongoing funding to support the expansion of mental health and substance abuse services focusing on the treatment, prevention, and/or awareness of opioid abuse by hiring one additional mental health/substance abuse FTE as required by the grant. An additional \$73,580.00 (inclusive of \$15,500 increase above our request of \$58,080), one-time funding supplement, will be used to enhance the health center's health information technology and training investments focusing on the integration of mental health and substance abuse services into primary care.
