WHEREAS. recreational boating continues to be a popular activity for millions of Americans, providing opportunities for relaxation, adventure, and enjoyment on our nation's waterways; and with over 100 million Americans participating in boating each year, ensuring their safety is WHEREAS, of paramount importance; and WHEREAS, on average, 650 people die each year in boating-related accidents in the United States, with approximately 75 percent of these fatalities caused by drowning; and WHEREAS, the vast majority of these accidents result from human error or poor judgment rather than boat, equipment, or environmental factors; and WHEREAS, the U.S. Coast Guard estimates that the use of life jackets could prevent nearly 85 percent of boating-related drowning fatalities; and today's life jackets are more comfortable, attractive, and wearable than ever before, and WHEREAS, their consistent use significantly enhances safety on the water; and safe boating begins with preparation, including carrying lifesaving emergency distress and WHEREAS, communication equipment, participating in boat safety courses, undergoing free boat safety checks, and staying sober while operating a vessel; and WHEREAS. National Safe Boating Week serves as an opportunity to promote these essential safety

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Pinellas County Board of Commissioners that May 16-22, 2026, be recognized as:
