#### Dear Commissioner Long,

As a longtime Substance Abuse Counselor and Policy Director for the Drug Free Florida Committee, I am deeply concerned about the implementation of Amendment 2. Since Nov. 8th, I've been doing all I can to minimize the damage of Amendment 2's passage by speaking to the media and traveling around the state to educate concerned citizens and activists.

But, as you know, the lion's share of the responsibility will fall to Florida's Legislature and the Department of Health (DOH). With that in mind, I have proposed several suggested actions to the legislature that would limit the damage of this poorly-written law; one of which should be of particular interest to you as a member of local government.

Whether you voted for Amendment 2 or not, I think you will agree with me on this point: the legislature must give cities and counties home rule. Not only is this the right thing to do, but it was also apparently the author's intent.

You see, in the DOH's analysis for the Fiscal Impact Estimating Conference, they estimated Amendment 2 would bring 1,993 marijuana dispensaries to Florida. That would outnumber the amount of McDonald's, Starbucks and 7-Eleven's in our state combined. Obviously, the prospect of nearly 2,000 pot shops was a major point of concern for those of us who were opposed to Amendment 2, and so in every debate, presentation and op-ed I made this estimate known.

When Mr. Morgan and I participated in a live debate on WESH 2 news in mid-October, he anticipated this argument and preemptively made the following promise to voters: "They're going to say there's going to be a pot shop on every corner. That's not true. Any municipality can ban it from their cities or county."

The legislature should not only consider that promise evidence of the author's intent, but also make it a reality so that voters get precisely the amendment they were sold. We must encourage the legislature to take Mr. Morgan at his word and ensure that local governments are expressly given the right to limit, restrict and outright ban pot shops from their communities. Similarly, localities must be rendered immune to any legal attacks launched by marijuana cardholders, the legal pot industry, or even Mr. Morgan himself.

All that to say, please contact your legislators and encourage them to pass legislation that will explicitly give cities and counties the right to limit, restrict and outright ban pot shops from their community.
