




Pinellas County Death by Fentanyl Overdose (2020 - Current)

Rates are used in conjunction with counts as they allow for comparison of the level of impact in different populations. Rates are based on 2020 Census Population.





Overdose Fatality Reviews



Fatality reviews are a valuable and impactful way to address complex public health issues including infant, maternal, elder mortality and abuse.

OFR Committees:

- improve data accuracy & systematic data-collection related to OD deaths
- identify patterns in drug overdose cases (individual, community & population level)
- enhance service coordination
- provide recommendations to policies and programs

Goals of OFRs:

- increase collaboration among various public safety, public health, law enforcement, substance use treatment authorities, and social service agencies
- identify missed opportunities and system gaps
- develop recommendations for prevention & intervention efforts

Opioid Abatement Funding Advisory Board:

- Managing Regional Funding Allocation Estimated at \$85M over 18 years
 - Pinellas Park, Clearwater, St. Petersburg, DOH and Pinellas County
 - County-wide Opioid Abatement Activities
 - Procurement, Contracting, Program Implementation within Human Services

City/County Allocation:

- Estimated at \$19M over 18 years
 - Collaboration with municipalities to manage funding
 - Safety Harbor, Tarpon Springs and Oldsmar
 - Procurement, Contracting, Program Implementation within Human Services
 - Expansion of Pinellas MATTERS


Medication Assisted Treatment & Emergency Referrals

- County-funded program, modeled after Buffalo County, NY
- Cultural presence within Bayfront Hospital ED
 - Physician Paired with Certified Peer Specialist/Addictions Professional/PhD
- Identification of patients with SUD (nonoverdose/overdose pts)
- Weekend Prescriber at Operation PAR
