- * The Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved the award of this contract on March 20, 2018 in the amount of \$10,073,604.20.
- * Prior change orders to this contract added locations not included in the original contract award, primarily the St. Pete-Clearwater International Airport (\$3.5 million), various locations for the Sheriff's Office, Lealman Exchange, and various other locations as identified on the attached spreadsheet.
- * This contract is established as a maintenance, repair and operating contract of which the Board must approve any increase exceeding 50% of the original award amount. Contract No. 167-0450-B(RO) increase in the amount of \$826,899.79 for a revised total contract value of \$15,985,187.34 with an average annual expenditure of \$3,197,037.47 through June 30, 2023.

Resolution expressing support of C1012942751 as a qualified applicant for an Economic Development Ad Valorem Tax Exemption.

Recommendation:

Adopt a resolution expressing support of C1012942751 (Company) as a qualified applicant for an Economic Development Ad Valorem Tax Exemption (EDAVTE) pursuant to Section 196.1995, Florida Statutes, and authorizing C1012942751 to make improvements before an EDAVTE Ordinance is adopted.

- * The Company is an existing medical manufacturing company that is located in the City of St. Petersburg.
- * The Company is considering building a 116,000 square foot facility and plans to invest \$1 million in equipment and \$23 million in construction.
- * The Company estimate they will create a minimum of 10 new jobs with annual pay scales of at least 75% of the average annual wage for Pinellas County. The project is located in a designated Brownfield area, which allows for projects paying 75% of the Pinellas County wage to be eligible for an EDAVTE.

- * This Interlocal Agreement with the HFA replaces the existing Interlocal Agreement executed on May 19, 2015.
- * This Agreement extends and updates the terms and incorporates the County's new Penny IV Affordable Housing funding for the Land Assembly Program.
- * The amount of fees and expenses for Land Assembly program projects will be determined on a per-property basis by mutual written agreement of the parties as approved by the HCD Director up to \$75,000.00. Land lease payments collected by the HFA will be used to fund ongoing operation of the program including an operational reserve in the amount of \$15,000.00.
- * This Agreement also defines the services provided by the HFA for the Community Housing Trust Fund and Neighborhood Stabilization affordable housing programs.
- * The HFA is a separate public body, corporate and politic established to alleviate the shortage of affordable housing and capital for investment in the County.
- * The Agreement becomes effective upon filing with the Pinellas County Clerk of Court and remains in full force and effect until terminated by either party. It shall be reviewed every ten years for updates and amendments as needed.

The team is reviewing proposed ideas including Bayside Clinic space usage and Street Medicine.

Recommendation:

- * The purpose of this contract is for the repair, rehabilitation, and replacement of sanitary sewer pipes at various locations throughout the County, with provision for emergency repairs
- * Change Order No. 1 increases the contract upset limit by \$1,200,000.00 for a revised total amount of \$5,515,619.80 and extends the contract term by 100 days.
- * Contract funds have been depleted due to emergency repairs resulting from deteriorating pipes and aging infrastructure.
- * The upset limit requires an increase to continue to accommodate emergency repairs and prevent sanitary sewer overflows until specifications for a new contract can be finalized, advertised, and awarded.
- * Sufficient funds are budgeted and available to provide for this request.
- * This contract was awarded in the amount of \$4,315,619.80 by the Board of County Commissioners on September 12, 2019 for 730 days through November 12, 2021.

Contract No. 189-0361-CP(PLU), PID No. 001272C; increase of the upset limit in the amount of \$1,200,000.00 for a revised total contract amount of \$5,515,619.80, extending the contract term 100 calendar days through February 19, 2022. Authorize the Chairman to execute and Clerk of the Circuit Court to attest.

- * The 179 existing family units are one, two, and three bedroom apartments; 16 units will be set-aside for households at or below 30.0% AMI, 144 units will be set-aside for households at or below 60.0% AMI and 19 units will be set-aside for households at or below 80.0% AMI.
- * The transaction will feature a full site renovation of approximately \$41,500 per unit. This renovation will include HVAC replacement and enhancement for higher efficiency, better climate, and moisture management, building exterior, building interior and individual unit work.
- * The total project cost estimated is \$26M.

Virtually - in advance in accordance with the instructions in the notice of this meeting, or on the virtual platform or phone after preregistering.

Members of the public wishing to make comments on the virtual platform or by phone must preregister by 5 p.m. the day before the meeting. At the scheduled section of the meeting when the item is before the Board of County Commissioners (Board), the Chairman or Clerk will call on each individual, one by one, to be heard. Each individual may speak for up to three minutes as may be modified by the Chairman. Comments or behavior that violate Pinellas County Commission Public Participation and Decorum Rules will be disconnected. Members of the public who cannot attend at the time an agenda item is before the Board may offer comments during the Citizens to Be Heard section near the beginning of the meeting. More information is available at www.pinellascounty.org/BCC Participation.htm or by calling (727) 464-4400.

Public Hearing Procedures

The procedure used by the Board in conducting Public Hearings is to have a staff presentation followed by the applicant presenting the specific proposal. The Board will then hear comments from the proponents, the opponents and a staff summary. The applicant will then be given an opportunity to close and the Board will decide on the matter. Public Hearings before the Board are governed by the provisions of Section 134 -14 of the Pinellas County Land Development Code as may be modified by Pinellas County Emergency Order. That code provides that at the conclusion of each person's presentation, any speaker may seek the Chairman's permission to ask questions of staff. Specifically:

- 1. At the conclusion of the presentations by the applicant and any proponents, all affected parties may seek the Chairman's permission to ask questions of or seek clarification from the applicant and/or the proponents.
- 2. At the conclusion of the presentation by the opponents, all affected parties may seek the Chairman's permission to ask questions of or seek clarification from any opponent.

The applicant's closing comments will address testimony subsequent to his or her presentation. Continuing rebuttal of other than directly preceding testimony will not be allowed. Because much testimony has already been submitted in writing, the following guidelines accommodate efficient presentations:

- 1. The applicant should present his or her entire case, including rebuttal, in no more than 20 minutes.
- 2. Persons wishing to speak regarding a Public Hearing item may speak for up to three minutes each.
- 3. Persons wishing to attend virtually must preregister at pinellascounty.org/comment by 5 p. m. the day before the meeting.

<u>Appeals</u>

Persons are advised that, if they decided to appeal any decision made at this meeting/hearing, they will need a record of the proceeding, and, for such purposes, they may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceeding is made, which includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.

If a Board meeting beginning at 9:30 A.M. has not concluded by noon, a recess will be taken from noon to 12:30 P.M., and the remainder of the meeting will continue at 12:30 P.M.

If a Board meeting beginning at 2:00 P.M. has not concluded by 5:30 P.M., a recess will be taken from 5:30 to 6:00 P.M. The remainder of the afternoon agenda will resume at 6:00 P.M., followed by Public Hearings.
