

- 144 responses






Public Survey

- 78% Botanical Gardens and/or Heritage Village
- 76% visit the park 3-4 times per year


Master Plan Development


- Identifies solutions for challenges facing the site's diverse functions and tenants

- Recommends next steps for implementation



- Rehabilitation of 119th Landfill (\$5.4m est.)


Current Projects
