	I am writing to you on behalf of the National Animal Interest Alliance (NAIA), a broad-based animal welfare organization founded in 1991 to provide balanced and fact-based answers to complex and controversial issues regarding animals. NAIA's membership is diverse and bipartisan and includes pet owners, hobby dog breeders, rescuers, animal scientists, hunters, pet businesses, conservationists, ranchers, scientists, and veterinarians. NAIA's expertise in animal welfare and husbandry is recognized nationwide and we have members in all fifty states including Florida.
	With regard to the proposed Pinellas County pet store ordinance update, I am writing today to urge you not to adopt any provision which devalues a legally operating Pinellas County business.
	Don't prejudge and punish responsible businesses: The ordinance update draft includes options that would devalue all businesses within a specific commercial sector because some individuals within that sector may be substandard operators. There are bad operators in every business sector. Basic fairness dictates that we don't prejudge and punish innocent individuals for the crimes or shortcomings of others who belong to a similar grouping.
	How much time should a legally operating Pinellas County business have to spend each year defending itself? Even if the harmful provisions listed in the update document are ultimately defeated, it is worth asking how much time a Pinellas County business should

have to devote each year to defending itself against a small, but relentless group of activists who are dedicated to their elimination. The county should be protecting its businesses from such harassment.

Please ask for evidence: As you listen to testimony for or against this draft or read the "whereas" declarations, please seek evidence. Ask the witnesses for the source of their claims, citations, and data you can actually inspect. Examine the "whereas" statements at the beginning of the ordinance draft to evaluate their legitimacy. Although many activists who oppose pet stores are well-intended and believe the claims they make, many of their allegations are outdated, irrelevant, deceptive, half-truths or outright lies. If you are being asked to devalue someone's business, the justification should be based on more than someone's belief no matter how compelling their presentation. Please seek evidence!

Our organization has worked on numerous animal welfare issues including this one for decades. We are subject matter experts on pet population trends, animal welfare standards in commercial kennels, pet warranties and return policies, and a host of other related issues. We hope you will use our knowledge base and data as a resource. Thank you very much for your time
