#### **DOH-PINELLAS Priorities**

#### School Health Nurses Initiative



- Began SY17-18 only 33 schools, School Year 21-22, Nurse in all 125 schools
- Number of services = 751,652
- Referrals to community service and agencies = 12,774
- Return to class rate = 86%
- Mandatory screening exceeded targets: vision, hearing, scoliosis and BMI

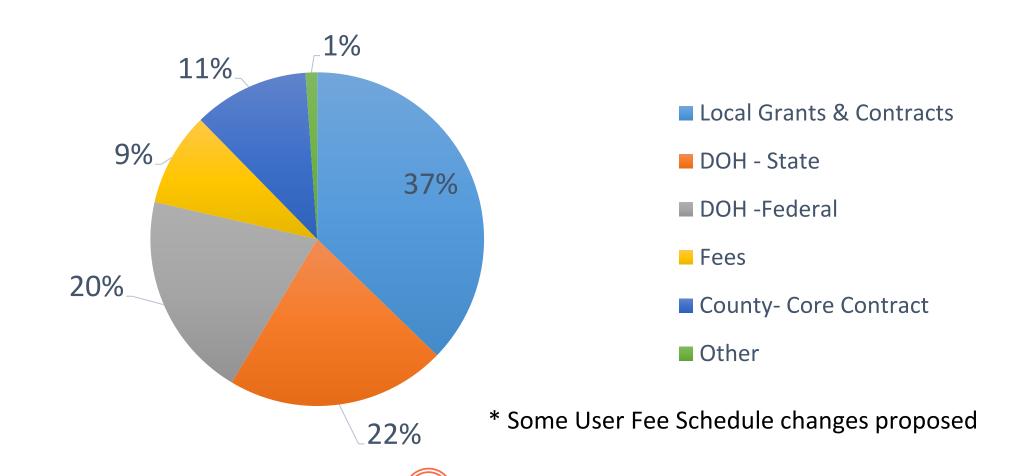

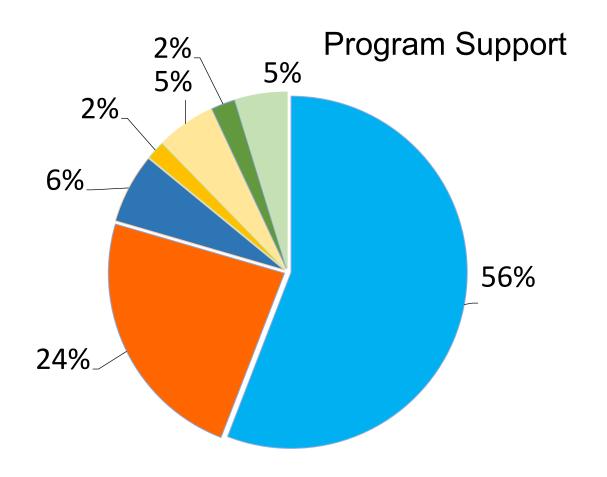
