**RESOLUTION ADOPTING FINAL BUDGET
FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023
PINELLAS COUNTY GENERAL FUND (PINELLAS COUNTY BCC)**

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, as taxing authority for the Pinellas County General Fund (Pinellas County BCC), has adopted a tentative millage to be levied upon property under its jurisdiction and a tentative budget in accordance with the fiscal policy of the Board of County Commissioners and Florida Statutes at a public hearing on 8th day of September, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined that the final budget based upon the final adopted millage is at the lowest possible level in accordance with sound fiscal policy; and

WHEREAS, notice of the public hearing to adopt the final budget has been published, and the Board has conducted a public hearing on the adoption of the final budget pursuant to the requirements of Chapters 129 and 200, Florida Statutes, and other applicable provisions of Florida Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners as taxing authority for the Pinellas County General Fund (Pinellas County BCC), in public hearing duly assembled this 22nd day of September, 2022, that the Board of County Commissioners hereby adopts each of the final budgets for Pinellas County, Florida, as established pursuant to said hearing for the fiscal year 2022-2023 as:
