AMENDMENT # 003

This amendment, entered into between the State of Florida, Department of Health, hereinafter referred to as the "State" and Pinellas County, a political sub-division of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "County", amend the contract pertaining to the operation of the Pinellas County Health Department for Contract Year 2021-2022.

1. The Department and the provider have agreed to amend this contract to reflect funding adjustments received from the Florida Department of Health, to update special project and trust fund balances, sources of contributions, planned expenditures, and to make other monetary reconciliations or verbiage adjustments as are reflected in the amended pages and attachments as follows:
 - a. Page 2, Core Contract, Section 4. FUNDING, Paragraph a. i, is hereby amended to change the "amount not to exceed" amount to \$25,215,696.00;
 - b. Attachment II, Part I, Page 1 of 1 is hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached amended Attachment II, Part I, Page 1 of 1;
 - c. Attachment II, Part II, Pages 1 through 4 are hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached amended Attachment II, part II, Pages 1 through 5;
 - d. Attachment II, Part III, Pages 1 and 2 are hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached revised Attachment II, part III, Pages 1 and 2;
 - e. Attachment V, Pages 1 through 3 are amended to show the current cash balances of existing special projects by replacing the existing provisions with the attached revised Attachment V, Pages 1- 3.
 - f. Attachment A, Schedule C Detail By Appropriation Category, is hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached revised Attachment A, Schedule C Detail By Appropriation Category, pages 1 through 5;
 - g. Attachment B, Reconciliation Between Attachment II, Part II, and Schedule C, is hereby amended by replacing the existing provisions with the attached revised Attachment B of the same name; 2 Pages;
 - h. Attachments D-E are hereby added to show adjustments in funding through funding memorandums from the department's Schedule C (6 pages);
2. This amendment shall begin on October 1, 2021, or the date on which the amendment has been signed by both parties, whichever is later.

All provisions in the contract and any attachments thereto in conflict with this amendment shall be and are hereby changed to conform with this amendment.

All provisions not in conflict with this amendment are still in effect and are to be performed at the level specified in the contract.

This amendment and all its attachments are hereby made a part of the contract.

and shall include those services mandated on a state or federal level. Examples of environmental health services include, but are not limited to, food hygiene, safe drinking water supply, sewage and solid waste disposal, swimming pools, group care facilities, migrant labor camps, toxic material control, radiological health, and occupational health.

b. "Communicable disease control services" are those services which protect the health of the general public through the detection, control, and eradication of diseases which are transmitted primarily by human beings. Communicable disease services shall be supported by available federal, state, and local funds and shall include those services mandated on a state or federal level. Such services include, but are not limited to, epidemiology, sexually transmissible disease detection and control, HIV/AIDS, immunization, tuberculosis control and maintenance of vital statistics.

c. "Primary care services" are acute care and preventive services that are made available to well and sick persons who are unable to obtain such services due to lack of income or other barriers beyond their control. These services are provided to benefit individuals, improve the collective health of the public, and prevent and control the spread of disease. Primary health care services are provided at home, in group settings, or in clinics. These services shall be supported by available federal, state, and local funds and shall include services mandated on a state or federal level. Examples of primary health care services include, but are not limited to: first contact acute care services; chronic disease detection and treatment; maternal and child health services; family planning; nutrition; school health; supplemental food assistance for women, infants, and children; home health; and dental services.

4. FUNDING. The parties further agree that funding for the CHD will be handled as follows:

a. The funding to be provided by the parties and any other sources is set forth in Part II of Attachment II hereof. This funding will be used as shown in Part I of Attachment II.

i. The State's appropriated responsibility (*direct contribution excluding any state fees, Medicaid contributions or any other funds not listed on the Schedule C*) as provided in Attachment II, Part II is an amount not to exceed \$25,215,696 (*State General Revenue, State Funds, Other State Funds and Federal Funds listed on the Schedule C*). The State's obligation to pay under this contract is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Legislature.

ii. The County's appropriated responsibility (*direct contribution excluding any fees, other cash or local contributions*) as provided in Attachment II, Part II is an amount not to exceed \$7,013,760 *amount listed under the "Board of County Commissioners Annual Appropriations section of the revenue attachment"*.

b. Overall expenditures will not exceed available funding or budget authority, whichever is less, (either current year or from surplus trust funds) in any service category. Unless requested otherwise, any surplus at the end of the term of this contract in the County Health Department Trust Fund that is attributed to the CHD shall be carried forward to the next contract period.
