



Statement of Purpose:





Coordinated Access Model






Opioid Epidemic

Opioid Dashboarding

Purpose

Create 24/7 access point for medication assisted treatment for substance use disorder. Physicians dosing/prescribing buprenorphine in the ED with peers connecting to rapid treatment.

Enhance first-responder response by equipping them with recovery support services (RSS) provided by professional peer support professionals, case management, and linkage to medications and therapeutic services that treat opioid, stimulant, and other substance use conditions.

Review decedent data related to drug overdose & using that data to inform broad prevention/intervention strategies including drug policy, treatment design, and improved awareness to support individuals in need of recovery-based services.

Established a fully automated data collection process for opioid data. Interactive visual presentation of indicators tracking opioid data to monitor and collaborate efforts related to the overall opioid overdose burden.

Opioid Settlement Funding


Opioid Abatement Funding Advisory Board:

- **Managing Regional Funding Allocation Estimated at \$85M over 18 years**
 - Pinellas Park, Clearwater, St. Petersburg, DOH and Pinellas County
 - **County-wide** Opioid Abatement Activities
 - Procurement, Contracting, Program Implementation within Human Services

City/County Allocation:

- **Estimated at \$19M over 18 years**
 - Collaboration with municipalities to manage funding
 - Safety Harbor, Tarpon Springs
