Background Information - DRC



Development Review Committee (DRC)

- Established by the 2018 major Code update, which defined its composition, powers and duties, meeting requirements, etc.
- Comprised of County staff from various departments
- Reviews and Acts on certain development proposals to ensure compliance with the Code and Comprehensive Plan
- Final authority on certain administrative adjustments and waivers
- Provides recommendations on public hearing cases to higher review authorities (e.g., Board of Adjustment & Local Planning Agency)
- Last Code update in October 2023



Proposed Ordinance Highlights



Amend the Land Development Code to provide revised review authority and composition of DRC

- Authority will change to a review and analysis body
- Removal of decision-making authority
- Provide a collaborative technical review and analysis to assist staff with their recommendation to higher review authorities
- Amend its composition to ensure members represent the appropriate technical knowledge
- Adjust its meeting requirements to promote flexibility and clarity
 - Meetings still remain open to the public

Proposed Ordinance Highlights



Amend the Land Development Code to provide revised processes for applications and decision-making authority

- Administrative Adjustments and Waivers, and Vested Rights Determination
 - Authority moved to County Administrator or designee
- Floodplain variances and Stormwater Manual Waivers
 - Authority moved to Public Works Special Magistrate
- Chapter 142 Airport Zoning variances
 - Authority moved to Board of Adjustment and Appeals



Recommendation



- Proposed Code Amendments are intended to provide flexibility and enhance customer service
- Reviewed by internal and external stakeholders
- Consistent with the Comprehensive Plan
- Development Review Committee recommends Approval
- Local Planning Agency Recommended Approval (6-0 vote)
- This is the first of two required BCC public hearings
