Dear Chairman Long:

The Florida Department of Commerce (FloridaCommerce) has reviewed the proposed comprehensive plan amendment for Pinellas County (Amendment No. 23-01ESR) received on August 7, 2023. The review was completed under the expedited state review process. We have no comment on the proposed amendment.

The County should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendment. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendment. In addition, the County is reminded that:

- Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., authorizes other reviewing agencies to provide comments directly to the County. If the County receives reviewing agency comments and they are not resolved, these comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendment after adoption.
- The second public hearing, which shall be a hearing on whether to adopt one or more comprehensive plan amendments, must be held within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments or the amendment shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to FloridaCommerce and any affected party that provided comment on the amendment pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(c)1., F.S.
- The adopted amendment must be transmitted to FloridaCommerce within ten working days after the second public hearing pursuant to 163.3184(3)(c)2., F.S. Under Section 163.3184(3)(c)2. and 4., F.S., the amendment effective date is 31 days after FloridaCommerce notifies the County that the amendment package is complete or, if challenged, until it is found to be in compliance by FloridaCommerce or the Administration Commission.

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) staff received your request for review of the proposed comprehensive plan amendment. We have no comments, recommendations, or objections related to listed species and their habitat or other fish and wildlife resources to offer on this amendment. While there are no objections to the amendment, the following general technical assistance information is provided to assist the applicant and the county when considering the potential for impacts to state-listed species. FWC staff strongly recommends early planning coordination meetings if impacts to state-listed species and their habitat are expected. To schedule a coordination meeting, please contact our office by email at <a href="mailto:ConservationPlanningServices@MyFWC.com">ConservationPlanningServices@MyFWC.com</a> and staff will be happy to meet with the applicant, county, or Department of Economic Opportunity staff.

If on-site wildlife surveys have not yet been conducted, they are considered as the most reliable method for determining the presence of listed species or potential habitat. Species-specific surveys are time sensitive and are best conducted by trained wildlife biologists with recent documented experience. Species-specific survey protocols approved by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and the FWC are provided in the Florida Wildlife Conservation Guide at <a href="https://myfwc.com/conservation/value/fwcg/">https://myfwc.com/conservation/value/fwcg/</a> or in the FWC Species Conservation Measures and Permitting Guidelines available at <a href="https://myfwc.com/wildlifehabitats/wildlife/species-guidelines/">https://myfwc.com/wildlifehabitats/wildlife/species-guidelines/</a>.

There are several public data sources and online tools available that may be useful during preliminary reviews before conducting field surveys. For example, the Florida Natural Areas Inventory (FNAI) Biodiversity Matrix Map Server (<a href="https://www.fnai.org/biointro.cfm">https://www.fnai.org/biointro.cfm</a>) which provides access to rare species occurrence information statewide, FWC Gopher Tortoise Permit Map (<a href="https://public.myfwc.com/maps/gtmapping/gtpermitmap.html">https://public.myfwc.com/maps/gtmapping/gtpermitmap.html</a>), and the USFWS's Information for Planning and Consultation (IPaC) system (<a href="https://ecos.fws.gov/ipac/">https://ecos.fws.gov/ipac/</a>). Natural resource mapping data downloads, including listed species data, are available at <a href="https://geodata.myfwc.com/pages/upland">https://geodata.myfwc.com/pages/upland</a> and the Florida Geographic Data Library at <a href="https://www.fgdl.org/metadataexplorer/explorer.jsp">https://www.fgdl.org/metadataexplorer/explorer.jsp</a>.

The liability to not impact or cause "take" of listed species, migratory wildlife, and other regulated species of wildlife is the responsibility of the applicant or developer associated with this site. Any interested party can refer to the Florida Administrative Code, 68A-27 for definitions of "take" and a list of species. If state-listed species are observed on-site, FWC staff are available to provide decision support information or assist in obtaining the appropriate permits. If federally-designated Critical Habitat or federally listed species are

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

Pursuant to Section 163.3184(3), Florida Statutes (F.S.), in its role as a reviewing agency as identified in Section 163.3184(1)(c), F.S., the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) reviewed amendment 23-01ESR (CP-23-01).

Background: Unincorporated Pinellas County had a 2020 estimated population of 271,044 and is composed of roughly 97 square miles. Residential, Conservation/Preservation, Recreation/Open Space and Public/Semi-public land uses predominate. Twenty-four other incorporated local governments collectively make Pinellas County the most densely populated county in Florida. A plethora of federal and state roads traverse the county, including I-175, I-275, I-375, US 19, US 19A, US 92, SR 60, SR 580, SR 582, SR 586, SR 590, SR 666, SR 679, SR 682, SR 686, SR 688, SR 693, SR 694, and SR 699.

Proposal: This is a map amendment to the Pinellas County Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map Categories and Rules to establish **three** new Mixed Use Corridor (MUC) land use designations under their existing MUC Future Land Use Map (FLUM) Category. The amendment follows the requirements of the Pinellas County Countywide Plan Rules for establishing such designations and facilitates implementation of the Lealman Form Based Code and associated Zoning Atlas classifications, currently progressing through the County's adoption process.

The land use designations to be added to the FLUM under Case No. 23-04 as described below are the same designations established in the Comprehensive Plan per Case No. 23-01.

Case No. FLU-23-04: This is a proposed Ordinance amending the Pinellas County FLUM by changing the land use designations on approximately 168.63 total acres comprising various parcels within the Lealman Community Redevelopment Area (CRA). The acreage and land use categories are further broken down as follows:


Approximately 36.5 acres, **from** CG, Commercial General, E, Employment, RU, Residential Urban, RM, Residential Medium, R/OL, Residential/Office Limited, R/OG, Residential/Office General, I, Institutional, & T/U, Transportation/Utility changed **to** <u>MUC-SU-NP</u>, Mixed Use Corridor-Supporting-Neighborhood Park District.

Approximately 38.71 acres, **from** CG, Commercial General, RL, Residential Low, RU, Residential Urban, RLM, Residential Low Medium, RM, Residential Medium, R/OG, Residential/Office General **to** <u>MUC-SU-LT</u>, Mixed Use Corridor-Supporting-Local Trade District; and

Approximately 93.42 acres, **from** CG, Commercial General, E, Employment, RL, Residential Low, RU, Residential Urban, RLM, Residential Low Medium, RM, Residential Medium, R/OG, Residential/Office General **to** <u>MUC-P-C</u>, Mixed Use Corridor-Primary-Commerce District.

FDOT determined amendment 23-01ESR (CP-23-01) has no impact on important state transportation resources or facilities within its jurisdiction, at this time. For reference, the proposed a MUC-SU-NP, Mixed Use Corridor-Supporting-Neighborhood Park District is highlighted violet; the MUC-SU-LT, Mixed Use Corridor-Supporting-Local Trade District is highlighted in blue; and the MUC-P-C, Mixed Use Corridor-Primary-Commerce District is highlighted in red.



Also, for your information, FDOT has incorporated a hyperlink to provide technical assistance so local governments (e.g., Pinellas County) can find FDOT projects quickly by selecting a road, city, or county, or by clicking onto a county on the Tampa Bay Service Area Map identified on the header page of the hyperlink. The site also contains current news about detours and lane closures as well as an interactive email sign-up to receive news email alerts.
