Description & Comments

(What is it, any issues found, is there a financial impact to current/next FY, does this contract vary from previous FY, etc.)

This is a subgrant agreement between the County and the Florida Division of Emergency Management for reimbursement of eligible costs incurred during the response to Hurricane Idalia in August 2023.

When awarded, this grant will benefit the County by reimbursing certain eligible funds which were expended from the emergency reserves due to the hurricane and the Countywide state of emergency associated with it.

This grant will be multi-year and multi-departmental, which will likely impact FY 24. OMB has already coordinated with Emergency Management, the St. Pete-Clearwater International Airport, Administrative Services, Parks & Conservation, Utilities, and Public Works regarding costs for this grant.

This grant will be administered by the Office of Management and Budget in close coordination with Emergency Management, the St. Pete-Clearwater International Airport, Administrative Services, Parks & Conservation, Utilities, Public Works, and any other affected departments.

The total amount expended is currently about \$2.5M, of which 100% - should all funds be considered eligible under the Public Assistance program - will be reimbursed via FEMA and FDEM. An additional ~\$105,000 is expected to be expended in FY24 for permanent repair work, of which eligible expenses will be reimbursed at a federal & State combined cost share of 87.5%. There are no other funding sources associated with this project.

This is not budgeted and would not likely require a future budget amendment.

Based on the thresholds for delegated approval, this grant application will require Board of County Commissioners approval.
