# **Recommended Action:**

It is recommended that the County Administrator be delegated the authority to accept an arbitration determination or enter into settlement in an amount up to \$250,000.00.

# **Summary:**

This is a civil action arising out of intersection improvements at Bryan Dairy and Starkey roads. Pepper alleges breach of contract by the County, and the County seeks liquidated damages due to Pepper's failure to complete the project within the contract time.

The Court ordered the case to non-binding arbitration which was conducted on January 23, 2023. An award has not been received. Once an award is received, the parties have 20 days to request a trial de novo. If a trial de novo is requested, the requesting party may be liable for attorney's fees and costs.

It is recommended that the County Administrator be authorized to accept an award up to a total amount to Plaintiff of \$250,000.00, consistent with his delegated authority in Pinellas County Code, 2-62, upon the consent and advice of the County Attorney and Outside Counsel.
