

EMS Advisory Council

- Mission
 - Study and analyze the procedures and protocols of Emergency Medical Services throughout Pinellas County.
 - Recommend to the EMS Authority (Board of County Commissioners) and staff such actions as deemed necessary to ensure high quality emergency medical services throughout Pinellas County.
 - Review and comment upon all rules, regulations and procedures that are adopted by the Medical Control Board which do not require emergency action by the Pinellas County EMS Medical Director.







Status of the EMS System

- Sustained increases in EMS Service Demand
 - First Responder Responses and Ambulance Transports
- Collaborative and Positive working relationships between the Fire Chiefs, Sunstar, Medical Director and EMS & Fire Administration – Never Better
- EMS Advisory Council is fully engaged and evaluating on all initiatives
- Lots of Fire & EMS System Improvements in Progress Doing Things!
 - Active Shooter Preparedness
 - Provider Wellness Cumulative and Post Traumatic Stress
 - Standardized Medical Equipment Bags
 - Technical Rescue Agreement
 - Water Rescue & Water Extrication Improvements
- "Data Driven Focus Group" with Fire Chiefs and County Staff
 - Standardized Performance Metrics, Maps & Analysis
 - Collaborative Approach "Best for the most; starting with the least"
 - EMS Advisory Council will review all ALS First Responder Requests Special Meeting in May
- New Ambulance Contract Implemented on October 1, 2015



Continuing Medical Education

- New Model is working well great collaborative approach by Fire Rescue,
 Sunstar, Medical Director and EMS & Fire Administration.
 - CME Steering Committee actively managing the program
 - Online Learning through Target Solutions
 - Scenario Based Hands-on Training in the Classroom Quarterly
 - 16 Regional Training Sites Established (Fire Stations and EMS)
 - Implementing High Fidelity Patient Simulators
 - Paramedic CME Instructors from Fire Departments and Sunstar
 - CME Reimbursement Agreement coming to the BCC soon
 - Countywide coordination of curriculum and training objectives
 - EMS Training Coordinator and EMS Admin Support in place
 - 950 Paramedics re-certified in Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS)
 - All Paramedics will be re-certified in Prehospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS)
 - County is now a National Association of EMTs Training Center



Water Rescue

- Fire Chiefs Committee working with EMS & Fire Administration
- Water Rescue Agreement being drafted.
- 5 Swift Water Rescue Instructors and 25 Rescuers will be trained this Summer (County Technical Rescue Team).
- 7 Fire Officers sent to Shipboard Firefighting School (partnership with TBRPC and St. Petersburg).
- Water Extrication Team initiative Equipment & Training with County support to establish Regional Capability
- Need to address Gaps
 - Water Extrication (submerged vehicle rescue)
 - Marine Rescue Boat at Sand Key currently does not have Firefighting Capability
 - No Fireboat or Marine Rescue Boat between Sand Key and the Skyway Bridge
 - Limited Capability in inclement weather (all boats are open cabin)
