NOTES: This Agreement will allow PAR to provide one (1) full-time Bachelor's Level Certified Addition Professional (CAP) to co-locate with the County's Healthcare for the Homeless program and facilitate the integration of primary care and behavioral health care for referrals made in consultation with the program Medical Director. Funding through this program will enhance the health center's existing model of integrated primary/behavioral health care by providing on-site Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT), assessment, and MAT for an identified group of 40 patients, 10 receiving Methadone Maintenance Treatment for six months, and 30 receiving injectable Naltrexone, or Vivitrol, for six months coupled with counseling sessions.
