RESOLUTION 16-___

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING AN EMS WATER RESCUE<u>GRANT</u> PROGRAM; PROVIDING FOR ITS CREATION AND PURPOSE; PROVIDING FOR THE PROVISION OF FUNDING TO SUPPORT OPERATIONS, MAINTENANCE, EQUIPMENT AND TRAINING FOR WATER RESCUE PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE ON A COUNTYWIDE BASIS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in order to provide Water Rescue services to the citizens and visitors of Pinellas County, it is essential to continue to improve and expand the capability, expertise and resources to handle situations where such emergency services are needed; and.

WHEREAS, the Fire fire rRescue agencies, through their Cities and Fire Districts, as well as other partners currently respond to various waterborne emergency incidents.; and

WHEREAS, the fire rescue agencies are all signatories to the automatic aid agreement among all of the fire rescue agencies within Pinellas County and respond without regard to jurisdictional boundaries when emergency calls are received; and

WHEREAS, the County, acting as the Emergency Medical Services Authority, wishes to collaborate with such agencies to establish a countywide Water Rescue <u>Grant</u> Program that will support <u>enhanced</u> operations, maintenance, equipment and training through a two year plan<u>including Fiscal Years 2015-2016</u> and 2016-2017; and-

WHEREAS, the County Emergency Medical Services Authority through County staff and the partner agencies will <u>continue to</u> develop a long term comprehensive plan during <u>the this</u> initial two year program.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PINELLAS COUNTY, ACTING AS THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AUTHORITY ("AUTHORITY"), THAT:

SECTION 1. EMS WATER RESCUE PROGRAM.

- (a) <u>Creation and Role.</u> There is hereby created an EMS Water Rescue <u>Grant</u> Program whose mission is to provide for the <u>enhanced</u> preparedness and response to waterborne medical emergencies and rescue situations through the support of a countywide program that provides funding support for operations, maintenance, equipment and training necessary to improve and expand the capacity and capability of the various Fire Rescue Water Rescue resources.
- (b) <u>Scope of ServicesPurpose of Funding.</u> In exchange for funding, equipment and training from Authority as outlined herein, the <u>services to be performed by the Fire fire Rescue rescue</u> agencies includes making will make available water rescue resources and personnel, who are trained and <u>equipment equipped</u> to respond to any Water Rescue incident to rescue patients and provide medical treatment <u>throughout Pinellas County</u>.

Water Rescue incidents include, but are not imited to, providing emergency response, medical aid, and search and rescue services operating in water, in all weather and all hazard environments in Pinellas County and its surrounding waters, including environments of extreme weather, flooding, debris, fire, fixed object, entrapment, ejections from vessel and distressed swimmers.

(c) <u>Definitions.</u> Unless the context otherwise requires, capitalized terms used herein shall have the following meanings ascribed to them:

"Dive Team" means personnel that provide dive, rescue, recovery and black water rescue services.

- "Fire Rescue Boat" or "(FB)" means a specialized vessel that is designed for firefighting, emergency response, medical aid and search and rescue.
- "Light Marine" or "(LM)" means a small, powerful and agile vessel such as a personal watercraft with a rescue sled that is used for rescues in many different environments.
- "Marine Unit" or "(M)" means a specialized vessel such as a boat or inflatable that is designed to meet individual mission requirements such as emergency response, medical aid, and search and rescue.
- "Rapid Diver System" means a fast donning, lightweight, all-inclusive scuba system to be used in place of traditional bulky scuba equipment.
- "Standard Operating Procedures" or "(SOP)" mean the then current established Fire Department procedures (600-22), or equivalent agency SOP, to be followed in carrying out a given operation within a given situation.
- <u>"Water Hazard" means extreme weather, flooding, debris, fire, fixed object, entrapment, ejections from</u> vessel and distressed swimmers.
- "Water Rescue" means the act of providing firefighting, emergency response, medical aid, and search and rescue services operating in water, in all weather and all hazard environments in Pinellas County and surrounding waters.
- (d) <u>Water Rescue Coordinators.</u> Participating <u>f</u>Fire <u>r</u>Rescue agencies shall designate a named person to serve as a Water Rescue Coordinator to actively participate in the Water Rescue committee, assist with equipment and training needs assessment; assist in the coordination and participation of their individual agency.

SECTION 2. WATER RESCUE FUNDING AND SUPPORT.

a) Supplemental Operating and Maintenance Funding. The Authority will provide <u>supplemental</u> operating and maintenance funding each fiscal year as indicated in Appendix "A". The Authority's executive director may add, change or delete units to match currently deployed assets.

Equipment and Training. The Authority will provide equipment and training, which may include instructors and training materials, but, shall not include funding for students to attend training per Appendix "B". Other identified equipment needs

- b) Equipment and Training. The Authority will provide equipment and training, which may include instructors and training materials, as described on Appendix "B", but shall not include funding for salaries for students to attend training. Other identified training or equipment needs will be met in the discretion of the Authority's executive director to the extent of budgeted available funds for such purposes.
- c) Term. This program shall be effective for the 2015-2016 and 2016-2017 fiscal years.
- d) <u>Fiscal Non-Funding.</u> In the event sufficient budgeted funds are not available in any fiscal period, the Authority shall notify the <u>fFire rRescue</u> agencies in writing within five (5) days of the determination of such occurrence.
- e) <u>Not to Exceed Cap.</u> Expenditures for 2015-2016 fiscal year shall not exceed \$150,000.00 and for 2016-2017 fiscal year shall not exceed \$300,000.00 for this program.
- f) <u>Authority Assets.</u> All assets purchased by the Authority shall remain the property of the Authority. Assets may be provided to Ffire <u>r</u>Rescue agencies for use through a "hand receipt" process. The Authority will maintain such equipment during the equipment's safe useful life.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
