PINELLAS COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

WHEREAS, fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

WHEREAS, Pinellas County fire rescue agencies are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and

WHEREAS, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), fires caused over 3,000 civilian deaths, more than 15,000 civilian injuries, and \$12 billion in direct property damage in the United States annually, and fire departments in the United States responded to more than 500,000 home fires; and

WHEREAS, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half; and

WHEREAS, three out of five home fire deaths result from fires in properties without working smoke alarms; and

WHEREAS, in one-fifth of all homes with smoke alarms, none are working, usually because batteries are missing or dead, or they are disconnected; and

WHEREAS, Pinellas County residents should install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home; and

WHEREAS, Pinellas County residents should check the age of smoke alarms and replace all smoke alarms at least once every ten years; and

WHEREAS, the 2016 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Don't Wait – Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years" effectively serves to remind us that we need working smoke alarms to give us the time to get out safely;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners that the week of October 9 to October 15, 2016 be recognized as

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK
