WHEREAS, Section 23 of the Agreement permits modification by mutual written agreement of the parties; and Section 3.9.2 (C) of the agreement provides that the Board of County Commissioners may authorize construction phase services; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Consultant now wish to modify the Agreement in order to provide for Construction Administration Services, at the same prices, terms, and conditions;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree that the Agreement is amended as follows:

- 1. Construction Administration Services are hereby authorized as set out in Exhibit A, Scope of Work, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference and additional funding is authorized as compensation for performance of the services in the not-to-exceed amount of one hundred ninety two thousand eight hundred dollars (\$192,800.00) inclusive of seventeen thousand dollars (\$17,000) contingency.
 - 2. The term of the Agreement is hereby extended through October 21, 2018.
- 3. Except as changed or modified herein, all provisions and conditions of the original Agreement and any amendments thereto shall remain in full force and effect.

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Each Party to this Agreement represents and warrants that: (i) it has the full right and authority and has obtained all necessary approvals to enter into this Agreement; (ii) each person executing this Agreement on behalf of the Party is authorized to do so; (iii) this Agreement constitutes a valid and legally binding obligation of the Party, enforceable in accordance with its terms.

Exhibit A - Scope of Work

Jacobs and its' subconsultants (Project Team) will provide Construction Administration Services for the Taxiway Rehabilitation Phase II at St. Pete-Clearwater International Airport (PIE).

General Information

The Project Team has completed the design and prepared the Bidding Documents for the referenced project. The scope of work focuses on the Basic Services associated with Construction Administration Services.

Assumptions/Design Parameters

- Quality assurance testing and review of test results has <u>not</u> been included in this project. QA testing and the review of test results will be the responsibility of the Construction Manager.
- 2. The construction phase services do <u>not</u> include the services of a resident inspector.
- 3. Total construction duration for the Base Bid is 225 calendar days and Additive Bid Items 1 and 2 are 135 calendar days. For this proposal it is assumed the Base Bid and Bid Additives 1 and 2 will be awarded for a total of 360 calendar days (12 Months). However, an additional 2 months has been added to this proposal for a potential contract time extension, for a total of 14 months.
- 4. It is assumed for this project that the Construction Management Plan will be prepared by the Construction Manager and is **not** in this scope of work.
- It is assumed the review of Contractor's pay application/certified payrolls/DBE Reports will be the responsibility of the Construction Manager and is <u>not</u> included in this scope of work.
- 6. It is assumed Project/Grant Closeout will be the responsibility of the Construction Manager and is **not** included in this scope of work.

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- 7. Jacobs's performance of construction support services shall be subject to the following terms:
 - a. Jacobs will not bear any responsibility or liability for defects or deficiencies in the construction work or for the failure to so detect but will notify the County of an observed defect or deficiencies in a timely manner. Jacobs shall not make inspections or reviews of the safety programs or procedures of the construction contractor(s), and shall not review their work for the purpose of ensuring their compliance with safety standards.
 - b. If Jacobs is called upon to review submittals from construction contractors, Jacobs shall review and approve or take other appropriate action upon construction contractor(s)' submittals such as shop drawings, product data and samples, but only for the limited purpose of checking for conformance with information given and the design concept expressed in the contract documents. The Jacobs's action shall be taken with such reasonable promptness as to cause no delay in the work while allowing sufficient time in the Jacobs's professional judgment to permit adequate review. Review of such submittals will not be conducted for the purpose of determining the accuracy and completeness of other details such as dimensions and quantities or for substantiating instructions for installation or performance of equipment or systems designed by the construction contractor, all of which remain the responsibility of the construction contractor. Jacobs's review shall not constitute approval of safety precautions or of construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures. Jacobs's approval of a specific item shall not indicate approval of an assembly of which the item is a component.
 - c. Jacobs shall not assume any responsibility or liability for performance of the construction services or for the safety of persons and property during construction or for compliance with federal, state and local statutes, rules, regulations and codes applicable to the conduct of the construction services.
 - d. All services performed by others, including construction contractors and their subcontractors, shall be warranted only by such others and not by Jacobs.

- 1. Prepare three (3) sets of conformed contract plans and documents for construction use by the successful bidder.
- 2. Participate in a preconstruction conference.
- 3. Participate in weekly construction meetings. Participation will included attending the construction meetings in person on a bi-weekly basis and participating via teleconference on a bi-weekly basis.
- 4. The Engineer of Record and other Team Members, as appropriate, will make periodic visits (up to one visit per month) to the construction site to observe and familiarize themselves generally with the progress and quality of the work. The Project Team will make periodic written reports to PIE and Construction Manager to advise of any deviation from the contract documents observed by or brought to the attention of the Project Team.
