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AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF PINELLAS, AMENDING APPENDIX A, THE TENYEAR WATER SUPPLY FACILITY PLAN, OF THE POTABLE WATER SUPPLY, WASTEWATER & REUSE ELEMENT OF THE PINELLAS COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR LOCATION OF RECORDS; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 163, Part II, Florida Statutes, establishes the Local Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Act; and

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2008, the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners adopted a Potable Water Supply, Wastewater and Reuse Element; and

WHEREAS, Section 163.3177(6)(c), Florida Statutes, requires local governments to adopt a Ten Year Water Supply Facilities Plan into their Comprehensive Plan within 18 months after the Southwest Florida Water Management District adopts the Regional Water Supply Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Southwest Florida Water Management District approved the Regional Water Supply Plan on November 17, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the recommendations from the Pinellas County Local Planning Agency have been received and considered.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of County	Commissioners of Pinellas

SECTION 1: PURPOSE AND INTENT

The primary purpose of this amendment is to comply with Section 163.3177(6)(c), Florida Statutes, which requires local governments to adopt a Ten Year Water Supply Facilities Plan into their Comprehensive Plan within 18 months after the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) adopts the Regional Water Supply Plan. On November 17, 2015, SWFWMD approved the Regional Water Supply Plan requiring the County to initiate the amendment to the Potable Water Supply, Wastewater and Reuse Element.

SECTION 2: Appendix A – Ten Year Water Supply Facilities Plan of the Potable Water Supply, Wastewater and Reuse Element, is hereby amended as depicted in EXHIBIT A of this Ordinance:

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

If any section, paragraph, clause, sentence, or provision of the Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgement shall not affect, impair, invalidate, or nullify the remainder of this Ordinance, but the effect therefore shall be confined to the section, paragraph, clause, sentence, or provision immediately involved in the controversy in which such judgement or decree shall be rendered.

SECTION 4: LOCATION OF RECORDS

Pursuant to requirements of Section 125.68, Florida Statutes, this Ordinance to amend the Pinellas County Comprehensive Plan is incorporated into the Potable Water Supply, Wastewater and Reuse Element of the Pinellas County Comprehensive Plan, located at, and maintained by, the Clerk of the Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners.

SECTION 5: FILING OF THE ORDINANCE; EFFECTIVE DATE

Pursuant to Section 125.66, Florida Statutes, a certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Department of State by the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners within ten (10) days after enactment by the Board of County Commissioners. This Ordinance shall become effective upon notice of filing of the Ordinance with the Department of State.
