# Ten Year Water Supply Facilities Plan (The 'Work Plan')

Identifies and plans for water supply sources and facilities needed to meet existing and projected retail and wholesale potable water demand within the County's Water Demand Planning Area

- Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) updated their Regional Water Supply Plan
- Triggers requirement for local governments to update their work plans (per Florida Statutes)

### **Summary of Changes**

- Previous Work Plan growth period
  - Capital Programs focused primarily on ensuring infrastructure investments met growing needs
  - Projects to address increasing operational and regulatory pressures on controlling supply and demand requirements on the system
- <u>Current Work Plan</u> stabilization of growth, redevelopment focus
  - Shifting to managing growth requirements towards the operation and maintenance of existing infrastructure to ensure a safe and sustainable water supply
