The following is a summary of the actions taken at the December 8, 2016 Eastlake Oaks Community Development District's Board of Supervisors Meeting.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Roll Call

Mr. Mendenhall called the meeting to order. Supervisors and staff introduced themselves.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Organizational Matters

A. Oath of Office for Supervisors Elected Via the General Election (Mr. Scott Roper – Seat 4 and Mr. Joseph Dinelli – Seat 5)

Mr. Mendenhall administered the Oath of Office to Mr. Roper and Mr. Dinelli prior to the start of the meeting; copies of the signed Oaths are attached hereto and made part of the public record.

B. Election of Officers – Resolution 2017-01

On MOTION by Mr. Robinson seconded by Mr. Nowacki with all in favor, Resolution 2017-01 Designating Officers of the District to retain the same officer structure, with Mr. Joseph Dinelli to remain as Chairman; Ms. Darlene Lazier to remain as Vice Chairperson; Mr. Andrew Mendenhall to remain as Secretary; Mr. Robert Koncar to remain as Treasurer; Mr. Stephen Bloom to remain as Assistant Treasurer; Mr. Don Nowacki and Mr. Chad Robinson to remain as Assistant Secretaries; and Mr. Scott Roper to be appointed as Assistant Secretary, was adopted.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of the Minutes of the October 13, 2016 Meeting

A change to the Minutes was addressed.

On MOTION by Ms. Lazier seconded by Mr. Nowacki with all in favor, the Minutes of the October 13, 2016 Meeting were approved as amended.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Manager's Report

- A. Motion to Assign Fund Balance
- Any funds not used at the end of the year, goes to the balance sheet for reserves on an annual basis.

On MOTION by Mr. Dinelli seconded by Mr. Roper with all in favor, the motion to assign the fund balance as of September 30, 2016 was approved.

B. Discussion of Pond Algae Issues

- There is an algae and Hydria problem on the littoral shelf of Pond A. The pond maintenance company has been treating it. The Hydria must be removed, as it is holding the algae.
- Plantings need to be done by March in order for them to grow healthy. Mr.
 Mendenhall has two proposals, which will be presented at the February 2017 Board meeting.

December 8, 2016 Eastlake Oaks CDD

Mr. Mendenhall discussed the issue with Oak Pond Court in which the shrubs and grass are overgrown.

- Mr. Roper is doing walk-throughs to determine the responsible entity for keeping areas trimmed throughout the community. A full trimming should be done.
- Mr. Mendenhall suggested Ms. Stewart prepare a new map for the District.
- The District has a contract with LMP, which can terminate in 30 days.

On MOTION by Mr. Roper seconded by Mr. Dinelli with all in favor, the District Engineer was authorized to create a map of the District in an amount not to exceed \$2,000.

- Mr. Mendenhall will make LMP aware the Board has concerns with the landscaping.
- Resident concerns were discussed with regards to landscaping.
- Mr. Mendenhall will obtain a quote for the area adjacent to the pond.
- The resident who complained about maintenance behind his home will be notified the Board is looking into the issue as well as issues throughout the community.
- Mr. Roper indicated the area behind the wall at the entrance where the electrical
 panel is located, has a tree with palm fronds thrown about, which need to be cleaned
 up. There is overgrown grass under the tree.

Mr. Mendenhall discussed the color for the pool tiles.

- The color must have a white background according to the Health Department.
- The two options are approved by the Health Department.
- The Board chose the original dark blue color for the tiles.

Tree contractor requirements were discussed.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Supervisors' Requests

- Mr. Dinelli has concerns with the holiday lights. All lights were plugged into one outlet, but everything was switched around, which should resolve this concern.
- Ms. Lazier discussed the flowers. Poinsettias as well as Red and white Geraniums should be planted. Ms. Lazier will work with the landscaping company to ensure the appropriate holiday flowers are planted.

Ms. Lazier complimented the way the bench looks.

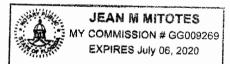

Plant Survival Guarantee

All plants provided and installed under the terms of this Agreement are guaranteed to be of good quality and free of existing disease or defects at the time of installation. A Warranty is provided for survival of 80% of installed plants for a ninety (90) day period following installation or until such time as another company other than Aquatic Systems, Inc. accepts the planted areas for maintenance, whichever is less. If survival is less than 80% at the end of the 90-day period or upon acceptance for maintenance, replanting (to 80% survivorship) shall be performed by ASI at no cost to the CUSTOMER. This plant survivorship Warranty does not include the loss or damage of installed plant materials due to acts of God such as flood, fire, drought or other catastrophic events nor does the warranty cover loss or damage due to theft, vandalism, erosion, pestilence, predation by turtles, fish or other animals, or negligence by others. It is the responsibility of the CUSTOMER to maintain water depths at planned levels. Plant loss or damage from excessively high or low levels is not covered by this Warranty.

Terms & Conditions of Special Services Agreement

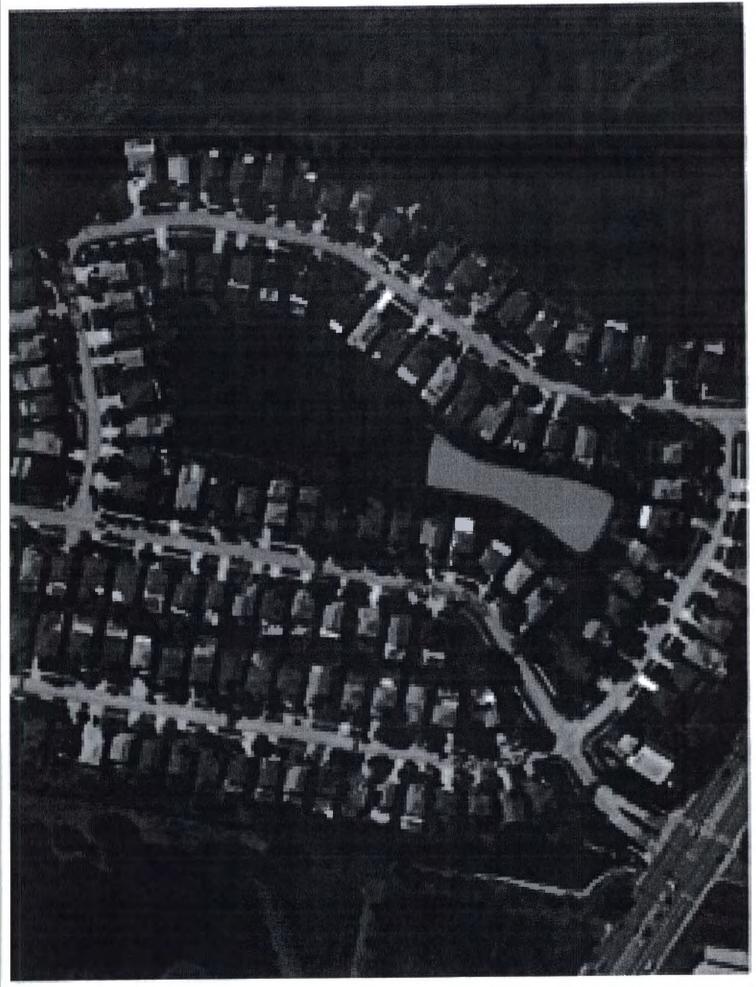
- 1. If CUSTOMER requires ASI to enroll in any special third-party compliance programs invoicing or payment plans that charge ASI, those charges will be invoiced back to CUSTOMER.
- 2. CUSTOMER agrees that the services to be provided are for the benefit of CUSTOMER regardless of whether the CUSTOMER has direct legal ownership of the water areas specified. In the event that CUSTOMER does not directly own the areas where services are to be provided, CUSTOMER warrants and represents that he has control of these areas to the extent that he may authorize the specified services and agrees to hold ASI harmless for the consequences of such services not arising out of ASI sole negligence.
- 3. It is the CUSTOMER'S responsibility to inform ASI of any and all work areas that are required mitigation sites in which desirable plants have been or are to be installed. CUSTOMER agrees to provide ASI with copies of mitigation permits, site plans, plant species, etc. relating to contracted work areas. ASI assumes no responsibility for damage to desirable plants where CUSTOMER has failed to disclose such information to ASI.

- 4. Neither party shall be responsible in damages, penalties or otherwise for any failure or delay in the performance of any of its obligations hereunder caused by strikes, riots, war, acts of God, accidents, governmental order and regulations, curtailment or failure to obtain sufficient material or other cause (whether or not of the same class or kind as those set forth above) beyond its reasonable control and which, by the exercise of due diligence, it is unable to overcome. Should Aquatic System's, Inc. be prohibited, restricted or otherwise prevented from rendering specified services by any of the conditions, Aquatic Systems, Inc. shall notify CUSTOMER of said condition and of the excess direct costs arising therefrom. CUSTOMER shall have thirty (30) days after receipt of said notice to terminate this Agreement by so notifying Aquatic Systems, Inc. in writing.
- 5. Water use restrictions after treatment are not often required. When restrictions are required, ASI will post signs and notify CUSTOMER. It is the CUSTOMER'S responsibility to maintain the posted signs throughout the required period. ASI does not assume any liability for failure by any party to be notified of, or to observe, the above regulations.
- 6. Aquatic Systems, Inc., at its expense, shall maintain the following insurance coverages: Workman's Compensation (statutory limits), General Liability, Property Damage, Products and Completed Operations Liability, and Automobile Liability.
- 7. Aquatic Systems, Inc., agrees to hold CUSTOMER harmless from any loss, damage or claims arising out of the sole negligence of Aquatic Systems. Inc.; however, Aquatic Systems, Inc., shall in no event be liable to CUSTOMER, or others, for indirect, special or consequential damages resulting from any cause whatsoever.
- 8. Carp Containment Barrier(s): ASI is <u>not</u> responsible under any circumstances for flooding or water damage from fouled water level control structures resulting from ASI installing Carp Containment Barriers on the structures.
- 9. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties hereto and no oral or written alterations or modifications of the terms contained herein shall be valid unless made in writing and accepted by an authorized representative of both Aquatic Systems, Inc. and the CUSTOMER.
- 10. In consideration of ASI'S providing services and/or products, the CUSTOMER agrees to pay its monthly invoice/statement within 30 days of the invoice/statement date. All amounts remaining due and owing 30 days after billing by SELLER shall bear interest at the rate of 1.5% per month until paid in full.
- 11. 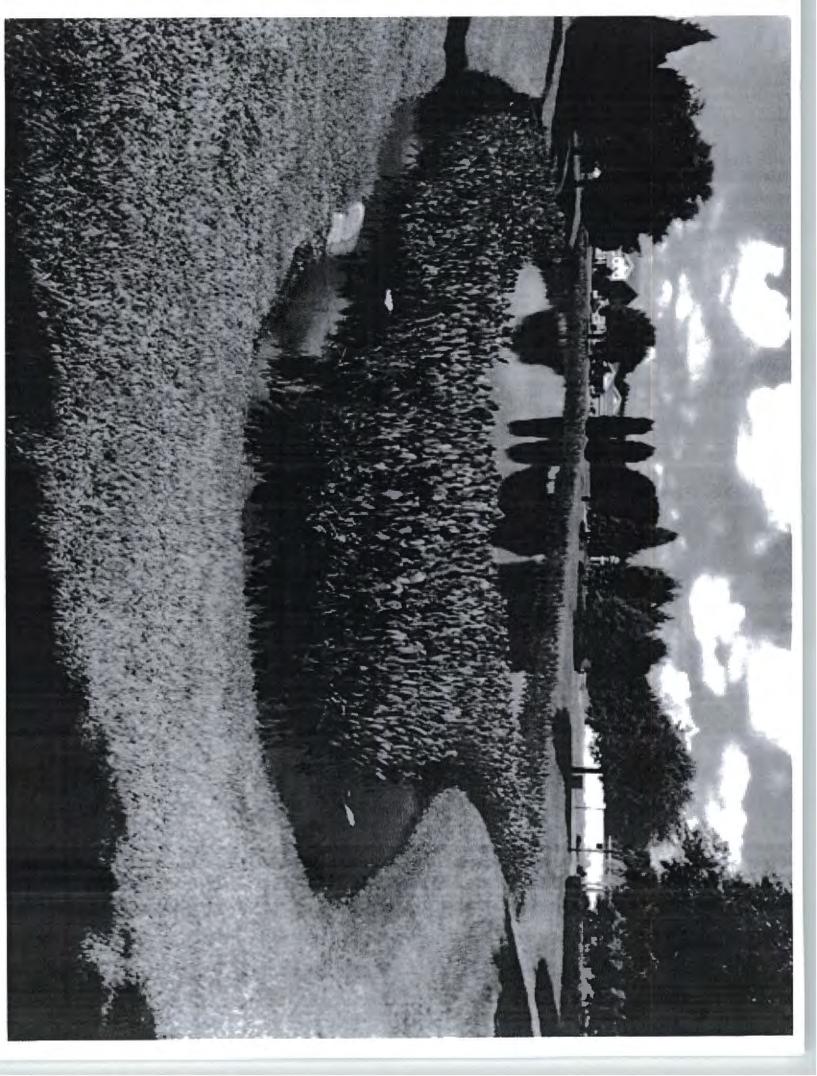

Gulf Spikerush (Eleocharis Cellulosa)

Gulf Spikerush (*Eleocharis cellulosa*), also known as Gulf Coast Spikerush, is a native sedge that inhabits shallow portions of wetlands, marshes, ponds and lakes in Florida. This valuable native plant produces attractive, bright green upright stems. The stems grow in clumps from stout rhizomes. Gulf Spikerush provides excellent wildlife domain for aquatic birds and is an important habitat for aquatic microinvertebrates.

Gulf Spikerush also improves overall water quality. Native aquatic plants filter runoff, trap sediments, and pump oxygen into the water. Dense growth of this native has also been shown to hinder invasive/exotic weed growth. In addition, this plant serves as an excellent bank stabilizer, and helps to mitigate bank erosion by reducing wave action along shoreline areas of lakes and ponds.

Gulf Spikerush grows in shallow water and can grow to 1-3 ft. in total height. The plant exhibits an alternate leaf arrangement (placed singly at different heights on the stem), not opposite or whorled. The flowers of all *Eleocharis* species are borne on unbranched spikelets at the very top of the stem. As is common with many plants, Gulf Spikerush is a perineal that blooms once or twice per year during the spring and summer seasons.

Dear Andy:

Our detailed survey of the Lake at Eastlake Oaks CDD indicates the need for beneficial wetland plant introduction.

Native aquatic plants are vital components of lake, pond and canal ecosystems. They form an important link between the base of the foodweb and the higher forms of plant and animal life. These plants provide protection, spawning and feeding habitats for aquatic animals, waterfowl and fish. Water quality is directly improved by the balance of ecological factors, including the presence of native wetland plants.

We recommend introduction of clusters of the emergent aquatic plant species as per the attached revised quotation.

These selected areas along the littoral region are indicated on the attached map.

Environmental benefits of a planting will be:

Creation of wildlife sanctuary and waterfowl nesting areas.

Sediment filtration.

Absorption of excessive nutrients (from fertilization and road runoff).

Erosion deterrent.

Increased food chain supply.

Improved fish habitat.

Enhanced aesthetics (shoreline is presently barren).

A total one-time investment includes all wetland plant material, labor, insurance and travel time necessary for completion of your planting.

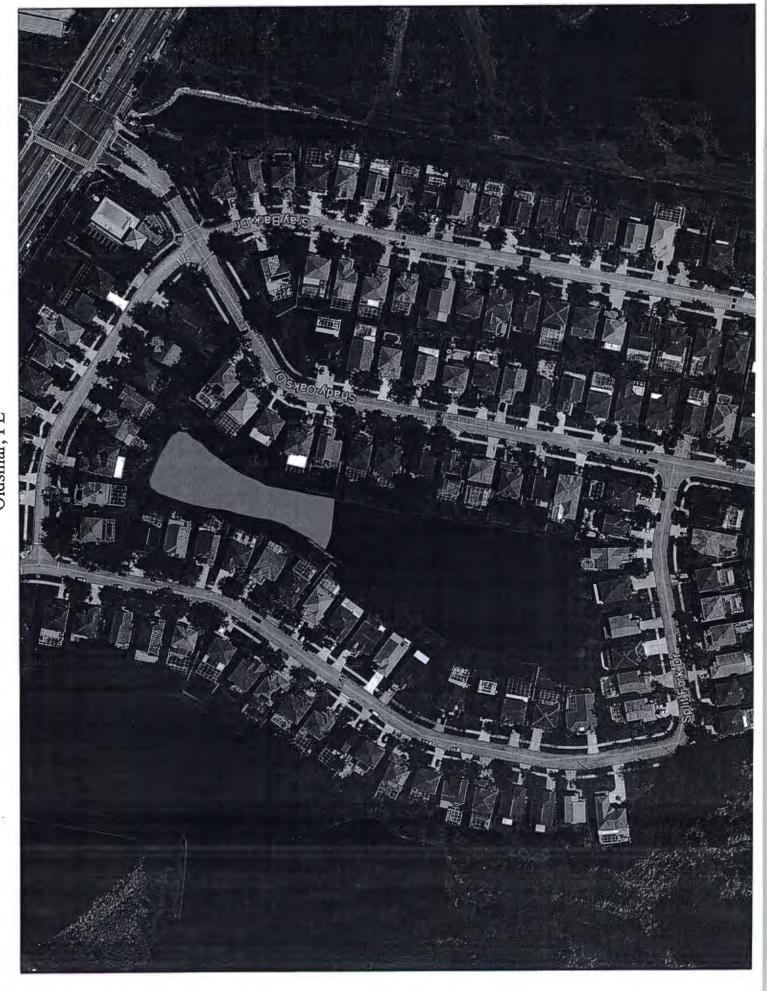

- 3. It is the CUSTOMER'S responsibility to inform ASI of any and all work areas that are required mitigation sites in which desirable plants have been or are to be installed. CUSTOMER agrees to provide ASI with copies of mitigation permits, site plans, plant species, etc. relating to contracted work areas. ASI assumes no responsibility for damage to desirable plants where CUSTOMER has failed to disclose such information to ASI.

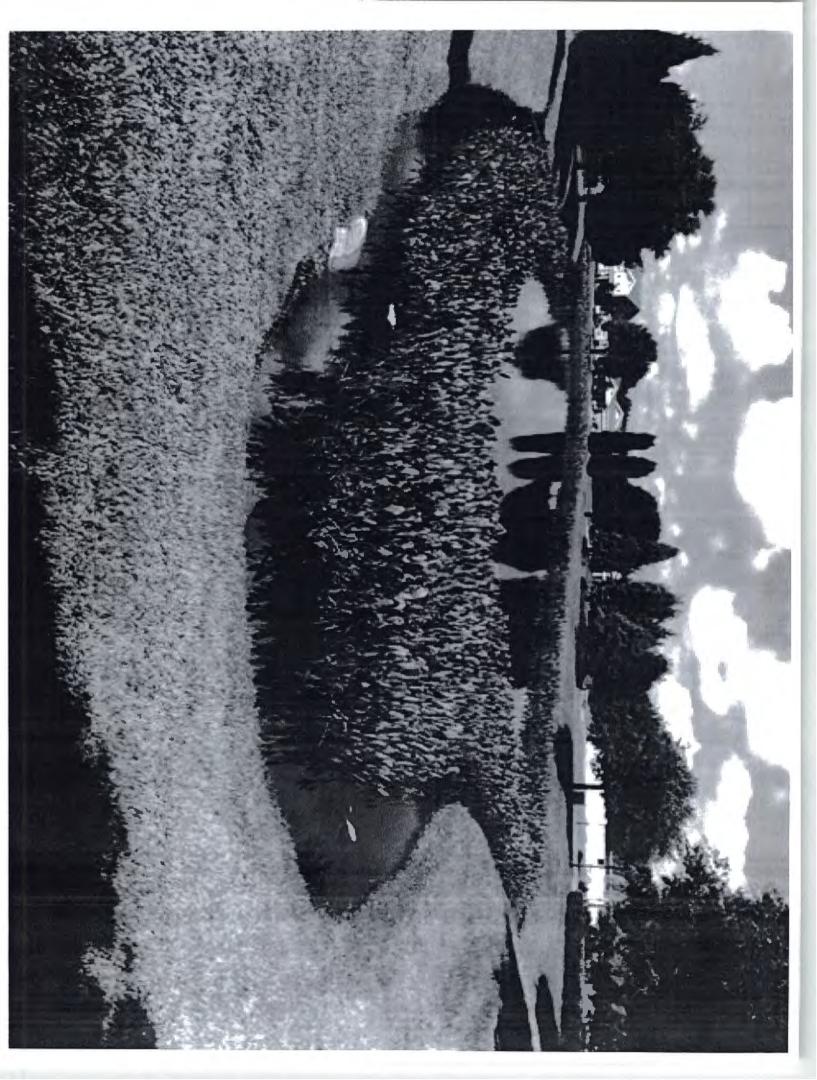

Inc.; however, Aquatic Systems, Inc., shall in no event be liable to CUSTOMER, or others, for indirect, special or consequential damages resulting from any cause whatsoever.
- 8. Carp Containment Barrier(s): ASI is <u>not</u> responsible under any circumstances for flooding or water damage from fouled water level control structures resulting from ASI installing Carp Containment Barriers on the structures.
- 9. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties hereto and no oral or written alterations or modifications of the terms contained herein shall be valid unless made in writing and accepted by an authorized representative of both Aquatic Systems, Inc. and the CUSTOMER.
- 10. In consideration of ASI'S providing services and/or products, the CUSTOMER agrees to pay its monthly invoice/statement within 30 days of the invoice/statement date. All amounts remaining due and owing 30 days after billing by SELLER shall bear interest at the rate of 1.5% per month until paid in full.
- 11. In the event legal action is instituted to enforce this Agreement or any portion hereof, the prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of reasonable attorney's fees, in addition to court and other costs, including, but without limitation, fees and costs in conjunction with any proceeding before any appellate tribunal. This Agreement and its Terms and Conditions are entered into in Broward County Florida, which the parties agree is the place of payment and the situs jurisdiction in the event of dispute.

NATIVE PLANTS FOR AQUATIC LANDSCAPES





Gulf Spikerush (Eleocharis Cellulosa)

Gulf Spikerush (*Eleocharis cellulosa*), also known as Gulf Coast Spikerush, is a native sedge that inhabits shallow portions of wetlands, marshes, ponds and lakes in Florida. This valuable native plant produces attractive, bright green upright stems. The stems grow in clumps from stout rhizomes. Gulf Spikerush provides excellent wildlife domain for aquatic birds and is an important habitat for aquatic microinvertebrates.

Gulf Spikerush also improves overall water quality. Native aquatic plants filter runoff, trap sediments, and pump oxygen into the water. Dense growth of this native has also been shown to hinder invasive/exotic weed growth. In addition, this plant serves as an excellent bank stabilizer, and helps to mitigate bank erosion by reducing wave action along shoreline areas of lakes and ponds.

Gulf Spikerush grows in shallow water and can grow to 1-3 ft. in total height. The plant exhibits an alternate leaf arrangement (placed singly at different heights on the stem), not opposite or whorled. The flowers of all *Eleocharis* species are borne on unbranched spikelets at the very top of the stem. As is common with many plants, Gulf Spikerush is a perineal that blooms once or twice per year during the spring and summer seasons.
