Dear Chair Long:

The Department of Economic Opportunity has completed its review of the proposed comprehensive plan amendment for Pinellas County (Amendment No. 17-2ESR), which was received on May 4, 2017. We have reviewed the proposed amendment pursuant to Sections 163.3184(2) and (3), Florida Statutes (F.S.), and identified no comment related to important state resources and facilities within the Department of Economic Opportunity's authorized scope of review that will be adversely impacted by the amendment if adopted.

The County is reminded that pursuant to Section 163.3184(3)(b), F.S., other reviewing agencies have the authority to provide comments directly to the County. If other reviewing agencies provide comments, we recommend the County consider appropriate changes to the amendment based on those comments. If unresolved, such comments could form the basis for a challenge to the amendment after adoption.

The County should act by choosing to adopt, adopt with changes, or not adopt the proposed amendment. Also, please note that Section 163.3184(3)(c)1, F.S., provides that if the second public hearing is not held within 180 days of your receipt of agency comments, the amendment shall be deemed withdrawn unless extended by agreement with notice to the Department of Economic Opportunity and any affected party that provided comment on the amendment. For your assistance, we have enclosed the procedures for adoption and transmittal of the comprehensive plan amendment.

The Southwest Florida Water Management District (District) has reviewed the referenced plan amendment. The amendment proposes a map change for 11.23 acres to residential low for the development of 56 residential units. The property is on Anclote Road in the northwest portion of Pinellas County, between the Anclote River and the Pasco County line.

The following technical assistance comments are offered:

# Floodplains and Floodprone Areas

1. District GIS information shows expansive FEMA-designated flood hazard areas within the property. Due to the associated flood potential, limited or no encroachment is encouraged in these areas. The implementation of low impact development (LID) strategies could help accomplish this. Potential LID options include, but are not limited to, designating the resource as open space, clustering development in upland areas and preserving pervious surface areas.

# **Regional Water Supply**

2. The developer is encouraged to maximize its use of reclaimed water (when available) and water conservation. Potential conservation measures for implementation include, but are not limited to, Florida Water Star, Florida-Friendly Landscaping<sup>™</sup> and the distribution of water conservation education materials to residents. We have reviewed the Pinellas County proposed Comprehensive Plan (the Plan) Amendment 17-2 ESR according to Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, and the Florida Department of Transportation (the Department) review guidelines.

Background: Unincorporated Pinellas County had a 2010 estimated population of 271,022, and was composed of roughly 97 square miles. Residential, Conservation/Preservation, Recreation/Open Space and Public/Semi-public land uses predominate. Twenty-four other incorporated local governments collectively make Pinellas County the most densely populated county in Florida. A plethora of federal and state roads traverse the county, including I-175, I-275, I-375, US 19, US 19A, US 92, SR 60, SR 580, SR 582, SR 586, SR 590, SR 666, SR 679, SR 682, SR 686, SR 688, SR 693, SR 694, and SR 699.

Proposal: The plan amendment is proposing to change 11.23 acres from Employment (E) to Residential Low (RL 5 DU/AC). The subject property (Anclote Road Industrial Park) is located at 500 Anclote Road in the northwest portion of Pinellas County between the Anclote River and the Pasco County line.

Comments: According to the transportation analysis, the Employment land use could generate up 1,575 project trips while the proposed Residential Low category could yield up to 537 project trips - a reduction of 1,038 project trips. FDOT has determined the proposed amendment has no impact on important state transportation resources or facilities. FDOT requests that a copy of the adopted amendment, along with supporting data and analysis, be transmitted.
