About Medicaid Long Term Care

The ADRC provides information about Medicaid programs for seniors and persons with disabilities. You will receive information about the Statewide Medicaid Managed Care Long-Term Care (SMMCLTC) Program, which provides long-term care services to individuals with Medicaid eligibility. SMMCLTC includes nursing home and in-home services in a managed care setting.

When you contact our ADRC, a representative will explain resources based on discussed needs or conduct a screening for long term care services. If services are not available at the time of your screening, you may be placed on a waitlist. To be placed on the waitlist, you must be a Florida resident age 60 and older or a person with a disability age 18 or older. Placement on the waitlist requires you to participate in an initial telephone screening and an annual rescreening.



Tawnya Martino, Director of Program Accountability


