

 - Technology & Situation **Awareness**





 - All bridges inspected within a week
 - Over 380,000 CY of debris removed
 - Traffic signals 148
 without power








Countywide water quality improvement

Sea Level Rise **Planning Tool**

■ 1,278 dock, dredge and fill permits





- Adopted 6 community ponds
- Inspected approx. 2,000 drainage structures
- Maintained 800+ miles of open ditches
- Increased effectiveness of street sweeping program
- Constructed 231 capital projects






