Keep Pinellas Beautiful has become a trusted resource to educators, a partner to community leaders, and a support network for individuals and groups. We maximize grassroots participation to produce community improvements with the most cost effective use of public and private funds.

Each year 80% of the debris entering our waterways is introduced from our streets, storm-drains, lakes, ponds, etc. through our watersheds. The work that our volunteers do to clean and beautify the environment is essential to removing harmful debris from entering our Pinellas County waterways.

Our efforts are the cornerstone for environmental protection, community revitalization, conservation and economic development. We work to tackle tough issues such as illegal dumping, roadway litter, water pollution, unkempt vacant lots, graffiti, and urban runoff into our local waterways and lack of green spaces. Through these efforts we are able to minimize the amount of debris that is introduced to our global system. We believe that collective action is the key to continuing our legacy that will Keep Pinellas Beautiful for generations to come.





2017 Great American Cleanup

Keep Pinellas Beautiful recruits volunteers, site captains and local sponsors to foster unity and strengthen community bonds through community improvement and beautification efforts across the County. We have executed the Great American Cleanup since 1999 by launching service projects based on the knowledge and needs of our local communities. During the Great American Cleanup in 2017, we engaged 4,207 volunteers who worked to abate 280,823 lbs of litter & debris and removed over 22,800 lbs of invasive plants from our public lands. As a result, Keep Pinellas Beautiful returned over \$325,000 in measurable benefits across Pinellas County, Florida.



2017 International Coastal Cleanup

Every year Keep Pinellas Beautiful partners with the Ocean Conservancy to coordinate the International Coastal Cleanup at numerous sites throughout Pinellas County with our dedicated site captains, volunteers and team members. Through these efforts we hope to eliminate the impact of marine and terrestrial debris within our Pinellas County ecosystems.

In 2017 with the over **1,500 volunteers** who spent **4,178 hours** of there time we were able to clean up **48,709 lbs** of trash.

As a result, Keep Pinellas Beautiful returned over \$90,000 in measurable benefits across Pinellas County, Florida.



Education

Education is fundamental in all that we do. Keep Pinellas Beautiful spreads awareness to students of all ages, providing resources and encouraging environmental stewardship throughout the community. In 2017 Keep Pinellas Beautiful conducted

262 educational presentations and participated in 42 outreach events within the community!

In addition, KPB brought together **46** high school and middle school students to become champions of their local communities environmental health through participation in our Youth Environmental Leadership Workshop and Watershed Stewardship Program.

These students were engaged in lessons and practical activities where they learned about the environmental issues that exist in our County.

Adoptions

Our Adoption Programs; Adopt-A-Mile, Adopt-A-Trail, Adopt-A-Shore & Adopt-an-Island are an environmental partnership between the citizens of Pinellas and Keep Pinellas Beautiful. Through Community improvement activities, Adoptees greatly enhance the appearance of our county by participating in cleanup activities 4 to 6 times a year that build community pride and ownership. In 2017 over **3,000 volunteers** removed **26,032 lbs** of trash from over **860 miles** of Pinellas County roads, shorelines, and trails! Our volunteer efforts, in coordination with this program, saved the county

Beautification and Community Greening

Keep Pinellas Beautiful partners with local organizations and community members to coordinate beautification projects throughout the country. We specialize in invasive species removal, Florida friendly landscaping and pollinator gardens, school gardens and tree plantings. In 2017 we planted **498 shrubs** and removed over **11,000 lbs** of invasive species! Keep Pinellas Beautiful also strives to engage as many community members as possible to take pride in their natural environment and work together to help beautiful their home.

Through a widespread community effort we were able to clean up **704,757 lbs** of litter with the help of volunteers that dedicated over **36,904 hours** in 2017!

These efforts saved the county over \$830,000!

The Pinellas Litter Hotline is a direct reporting phone connection for any Pinellas County citizen to report litter problems and/or concerns they may have. If a citizen observes litter they can call the 24 hour reporting line and Keep Pinellas Beautiful will further investigate and often remove the litter.

In 2017 KPB received 292 calls and removed over

75,000 lbs of litter through this program!
