



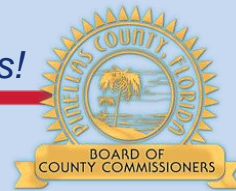

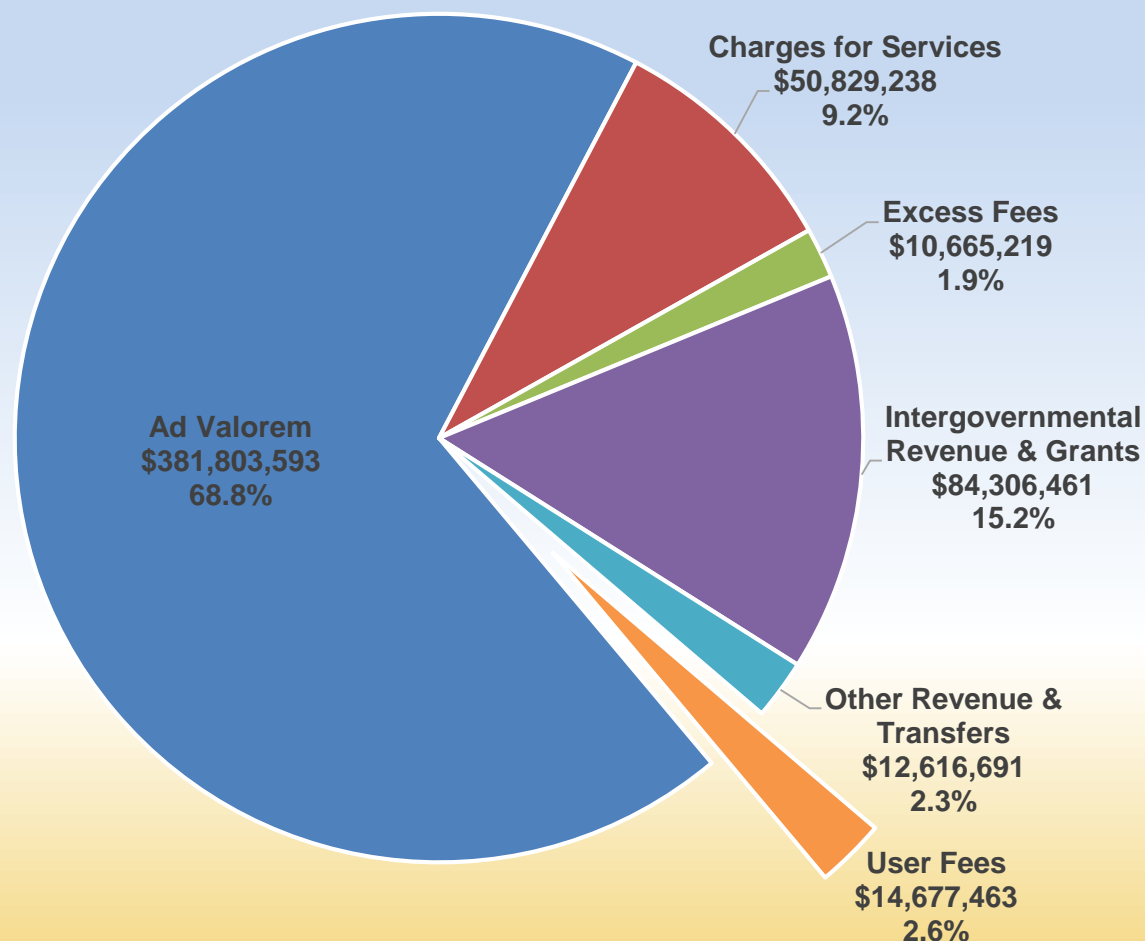
Board Policy Guidelines: Fees

Align the beneficiary of a service to the funding level for that service.

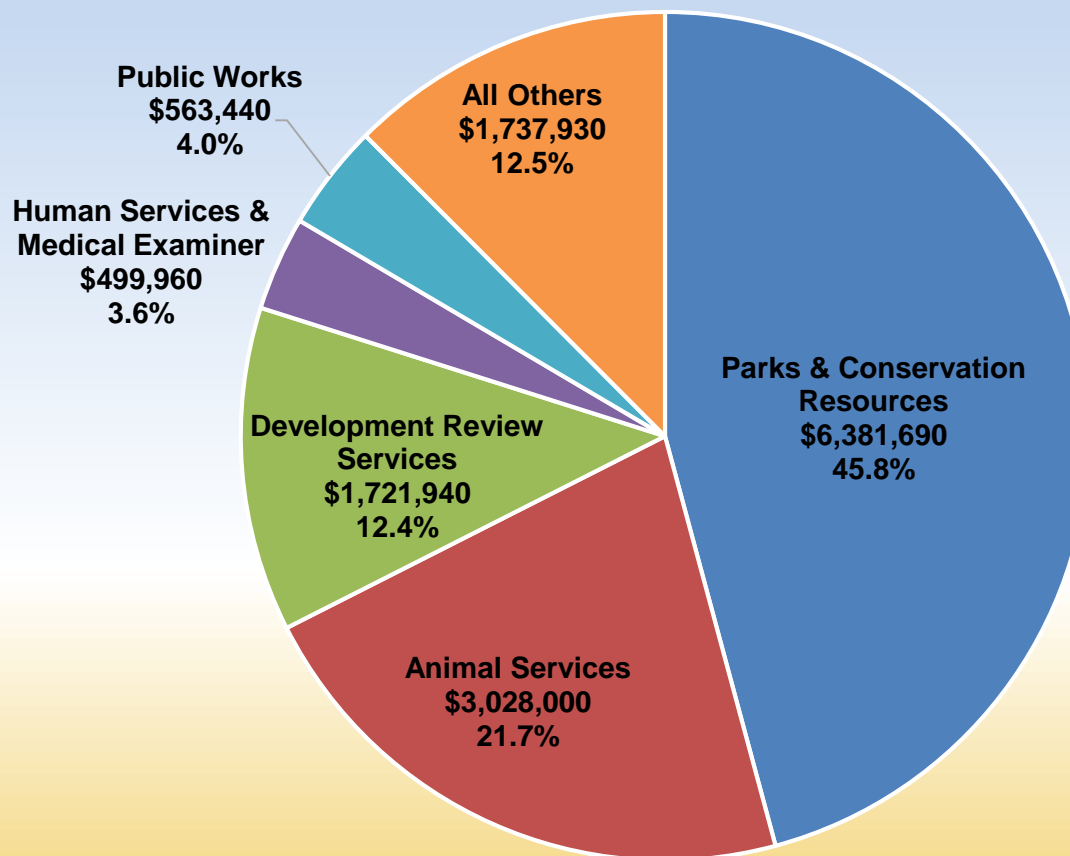
Considerations in setting fees:

- Competitive with our Peers
- Economic Impact / Affordability

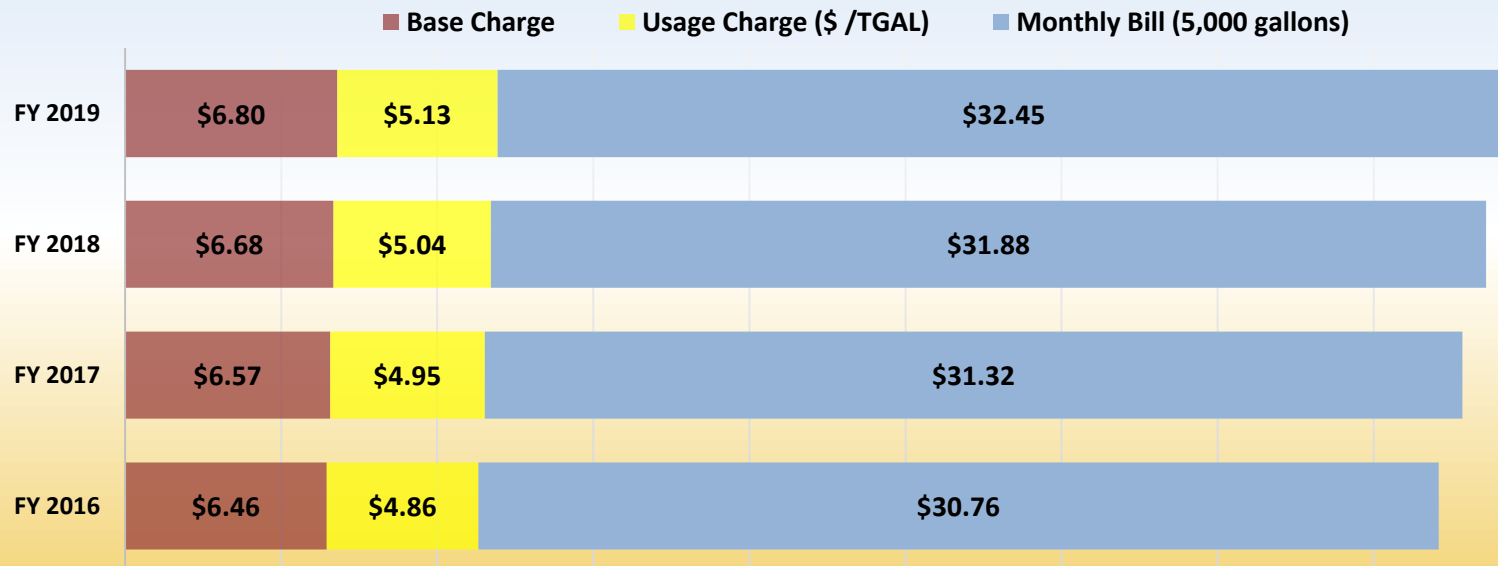
Utilities Rate Overview

- Board approved a four-year plan of rate adjustments on May 19, 2015 for FY16-FY19
- Annual rate plan reviewed during forecast and budget development
- New four-year rate study begins this July, with presentation to the Board in January 2019

Water System Update

- Demand projections and revenues in line with rate plan
- No significant increase in budgeted operating costs, including Tampa Bay Water rate
- Projected to maintain sufficient resources to fund Capital requirements and adequate reserves

RETAIL SERVICE RATES ADOPTED (1.75% ANNUAL INCREASE)

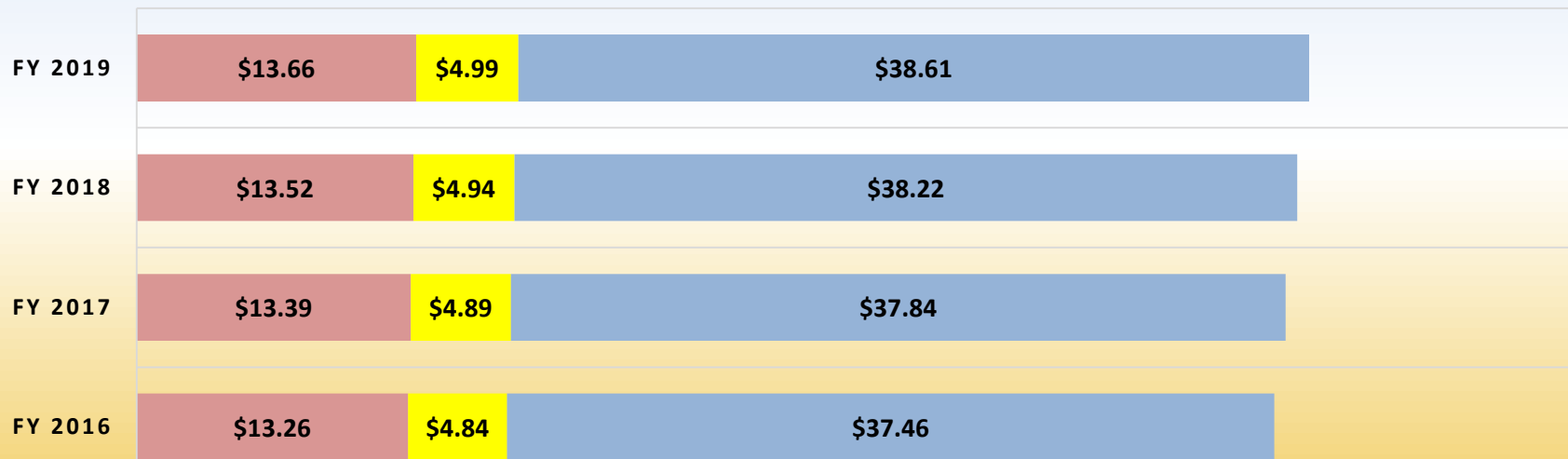


Sewer System Update

- Demand projections and revenues in line with rate plan
- **Experiencing increased operating and capital costs to address inflow and infiltration (I&I) and aging infrastructure**
- Projected to require additional resources starting in FY20 to fund capital requirements, debt service, and adequate reserves

RETAIL SERVICE RATES ADOPTED (1.0% ANNUAL INCREASE)

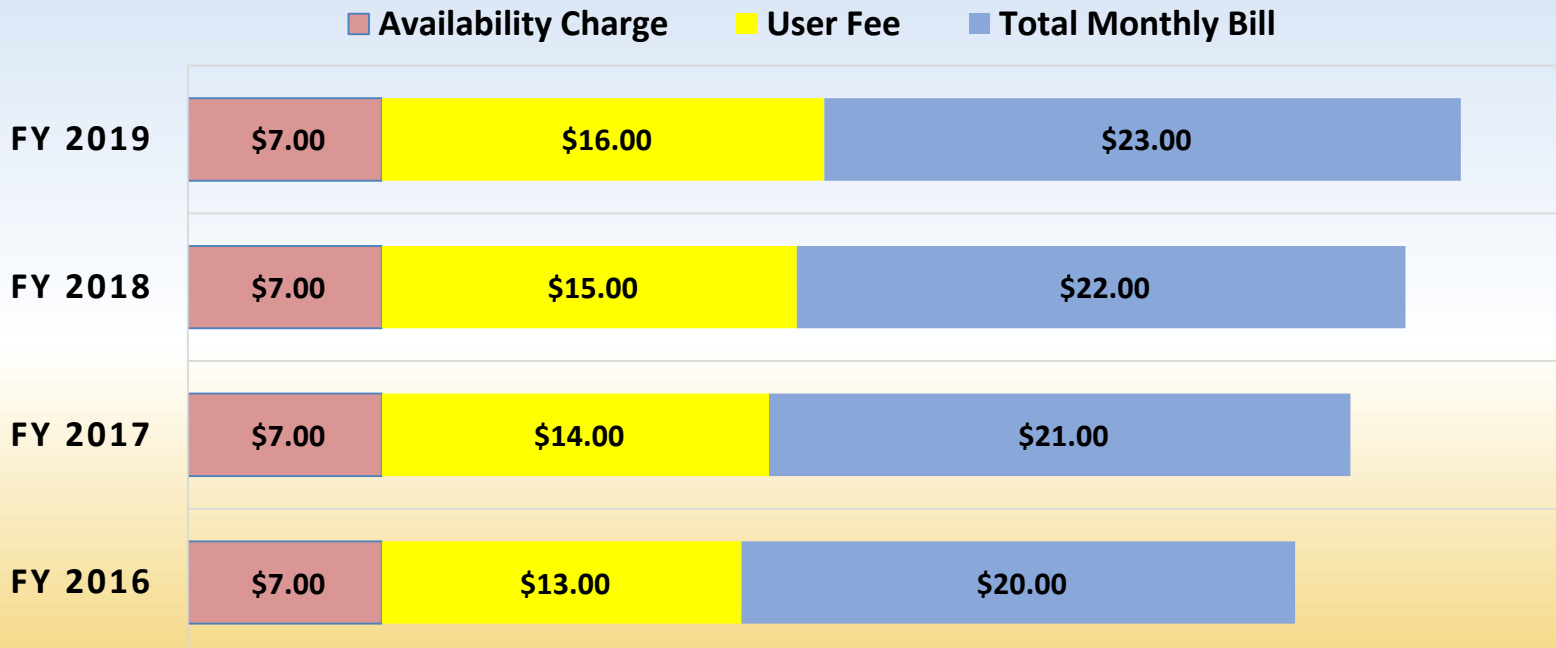
■ Base Charge ■ Usage Charge (\$ /TGAL) ■ Monthly Bill (5,000 gallons)



Reclaimed Water System Update

- Costs and revenues in line with rate plan
- Retail reclaimed water rate revenues provide 54% of the full cost of service

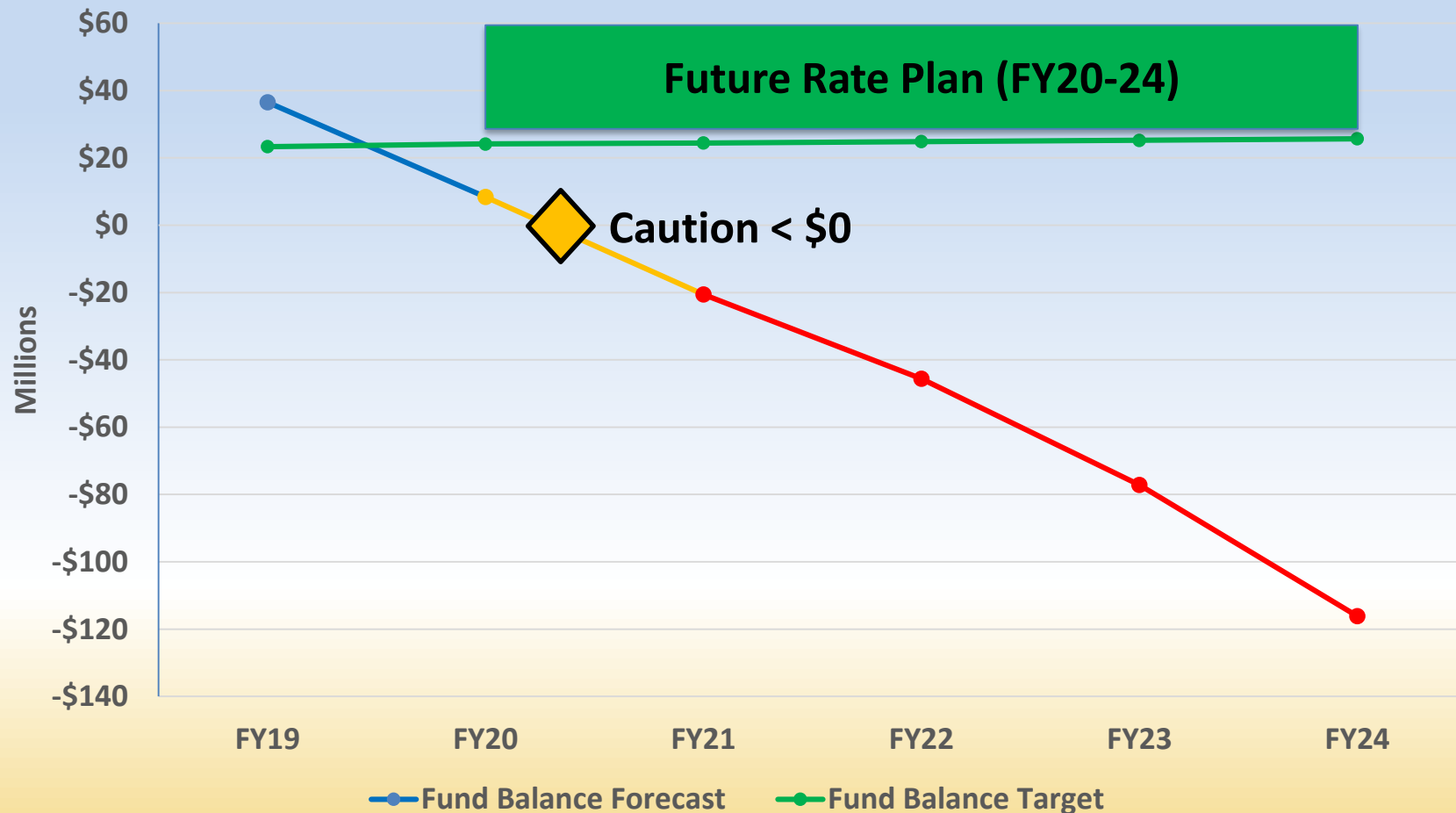
RECLAIMED WATER RATES ADOPTED UNMETERED/UNFUNDED (\$1.00 ANNUAL INCREASE=4.5%)

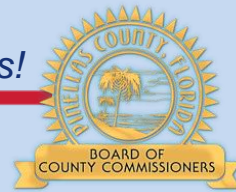


Reclaimed Water Summary

- **Funded System – Connection lines paid by developer/contractor (in North County – 8% funded)**
 - Unmetered FY 2019 monthly rate - \$22.00
 - Metered FY 2019 monthly rate - \$23.20
 - 20,000 gallons monthly usage
- **Unfunded System – Connection lines paid by Pinellas County (in North County – 92% unfunded)**
 - Unmetered FY 2019 monthly rate - \$23.00
 - Metered FY 2019 monthly rate - \$30.20
 - 20,000 gallons monthly usage
