What's on the ballot?

Additional Homestead Property Tax Exemption

On Nov. 6, voters will decide on a proposed statewide amendment that would provide an additional homestead property tax exemption for certain primary residences on Assessed Value from \$100,000-\$125,000. The amendment would take effect Jan. 1, 2019.

How does Amendment 1 impact our community?

2 in 3 Pinellas homes **would not qualify** for additional exemption on property taxes

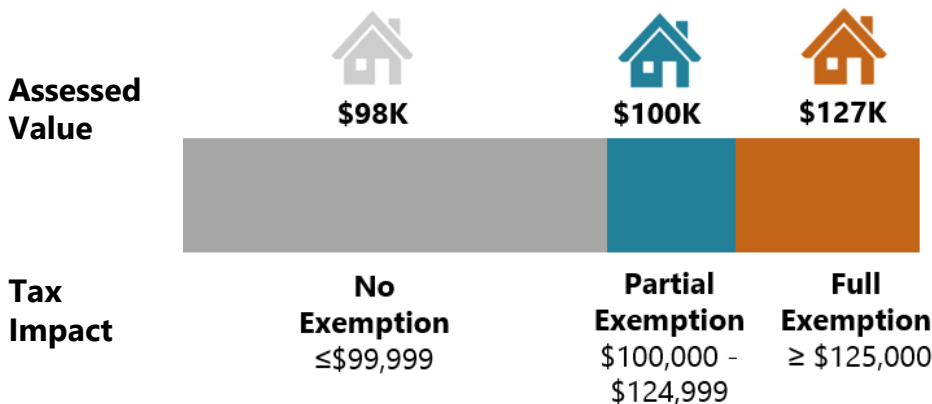
Businesses & renters **do not qualify**

Projected loss in local government funds that support essential public services – e.g. police, EMS, fire, libraries, parks & more.



Would you qualify for the exemption?

Only **primary residences** with an **Assessed Value of \$100,000-\$125,000 or more** would qualify for the proposed additional exemption. Assessed Value is typically less than Market Value and constrained by the Save-Our-Homes Cap on property taxes.
