## AGREEMENT AND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING TAMPA AUGMENTATION PROJECT BENEFITS SUMMARY<sup>1</sup>

- 1. \$7 million payment from Tampa to Tampa Bay Water to be paid in 3 installments.<sup>2</sup>
  - a. \$2,333,333.34 to be paid in December 2019;
  - b. \$2,333,333.33 to be paid in December 2020; and
  - c. \$2,333,333.33 to be paid in December 2021.<sup>3</sup>
- 2. 10 MGD of reclaimed water from Tampa available to be used in SHARP resulting in potential additional permitting credits for Tampa Bay Water's use.<sup>4</sup>
- 3. 6 MGD of potable water resulting from Tampa's release of Tampa Bay Water's obligation to budget and provide for the delivery of water to Tampa.
  - a. Tampa to provide an annual report to Tampa Bay Water on the progress of TAP implementation starting in December 2019.
  - b. By December 31, 2022, Tampa must inform Tampa Bay Water of a date certain no later than December 31, 2027 by which TAP will be fully functioning.<sup>5</sup>
  - c. TAP projected to be fully functioning by December 31, 2027.
- 4. Up to 20 MGD of raw water on annual average to Tampa Bay Water from the current "20/40" permit.
  - a. Dependent on SWFWMD modification of current permit.<sup>6</sup>
  - b. The actual quantity will depend on hydrologic conditions, regional demand, and SWFWMD permitting approval.
- 5. Preserves the benefits of the Interlocal Agreement<sup>7</sup> and assures resource allocation and permitting will be cooperative rather than competitive among Member Governments.
