FACADE FOCUS

Residential and nonresidential rehabilitation and demolition grant programs were launched at the beginning of the year. These programs were designed to reduce the costs associated with residential improvements in order to improve existing housing stock, accelerate and leverage private investment as a way to improve the condition and functionality of non-residential buildings, and assist with the removal of substandard structures and blighting, respectively.


CONNECTIVITY
