MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

- 1,000,000lbs of food distributed last year
- Over 32 bulk distributions to smaller pantries and low-income areas
- 1,229 families fed monthly through Adopt-a-Block alone
- Over 841,000 meals provided each year

- SNAP registration
- Medicare/Medicaid registration

WORK READINESS TRAINING

 Supportive employment for underskilled individuals

- Classes conducted 1-2 per month for a class of up to 6 individuals



January 2018 to date:

- 68 participants
- 96% certification completed
- 47% immediate employment
- 96% retention employment rate
- 53% additional case management introduced to aid with barriers





TINY HOMES objectives

- 1. Build Tiny Homes that will enhance the neighborhood
- 2. Provide collaborative wrap around services in a co-case management setting
- 3. Provide aesthetically pleasing in-fill for otherwise blighted areas
