Description & Comments			
(What is it, any issues found, is there a financial impact to current/next FY, does this contract vary from previous FY, etc.)			
<p>These agreements between the County and the cities of St. Petersburg and St. Pete Beach provide for the continued service of Advanced Life Support Emergency Medical Services from first responders. Each agreement has a term of five (5) years, beginning October 1, 2019 and ending September 30, 2024. Each agreement also provides for one (1) five-year extension following the end of the initial term.</p> <p>Under the agreements, but separate from the funding amounts listed above, the County is responsible for providing a Continuing Medical Education training program, communications equipment, medical supplies, electrocardiogram equipment, biohazardous waste collection and patient care reporting system equipment. Replacement of Authority funded rescue unit vehicles, medic unit vehicles and EMS Coordinator staff vehicles is scheduled in Appendix A of the agreements. The contract amounts for FY20 total \$17,303,983 (St. Pete Beach: \$1,912,908; St. Petersburg \$15,391,075).</p> <p>FY20 includes an EMS system enhancement for each of the cities in the form of partial funding for an EMS coordinator position for the City of St. Pete Beach and partial funding for a Rescue Captain position for the City of St. Petersburg. The positions will be funded for 50% of the year in FY20 and will be fully funded beginning in FY21.</p> <p>Per the agreements, future budgets are capped at a 3.0% annual increase over the prior fiscal year. Allowable station and overhead costs of 1.0% are also funded pending an audit of the submitted costs. The contracts are consistent with the request included in the FY20 Adopted Budget for the Emergency Medical Services Fund.</p>
