Board Meeing 2-Apr-2020	<p>Hello,</p> <p>I would like to attend this meeting to speak directly to the board concerning the extension of the emergency orders, however, I'm not sure it is wise for me to attend a gathering or whether I would even be allowed to attend if I drove there. So I am hoping this can be read at the meeting in lieu of my attending. I believe it is appropriate to extend the safer at home order. However, I believe the beach closure should be modified. I believe the intent is to encourage social distancing. Therefore, I would propose keeping the public beach parking areas closed, but do not extend the general beach closure. People that live within a mile of the beach are stacked pretty closely together, and the beach is the only place they can really get fresh air and exercise. You should not criminalize their use of the beach or restrict their access to the beach. People who live further from the beach have other expectations to get exercise (larger yards, parks close by) but there are few other opportunities for those living near the beach. By keeping public beach parking closed, you limit beach usage, but still allow residents to use the beach within social distancing requirements. We all still need to be able to get out, get fresh air, and get exercise because lack of those things will likely negatively affect our immune systems and make it more likely to get sick. In addition, by closing the beach access points, you force more people to attempt to use what parks are available and thereby end up causing the crowding that a beach closure is supposedly designed to eliminate.</p>
Considerations for nonessential business	<p>While I appreciate still being employed, I'm concerned in the current climate that we are facing. As considerations have been made to follow cdc guidelines for social distancing, I fear some residents may not be taking it as seriously as it should be. Continuation of Golf Course Maintenance Operations During COVID-19 Response	<p>Board of County Commissioners Pinellas County 315 Court Street Clearwater, FL 33756</p> <p>Dear Commissioners,</p> <p>On behalf of the Florida golf industry and the nearly 1,200 golf courses in the state, we stand ready to do our part as local communities, states and the nation continue to respond to the Novel Coronavirus outbreak. We know that you have and will continue to be called upon to make difficult decisions in response to this crisis and we recognize that public safety is paramount.</p> <p>The golf industry is recommending that in certain cases when it becomes necessary to close the outdoor golf courses to the public during the pandemic, golf course maintenance must be allowed to proceed during the shutdown. An average golf course of 150 acres is a living ecosystem requiring continued maintenance. Spring is a critical time for turfgrass, and it cannot be neglected for an extended period or it will be lost, and the community will lose a vital asset. In addition, performing required maintenance will deter crime and vandalism that could occur at an unmonitored property while also deterring pests, such as mosquitoes or ticks, which can quickly multiply in unmanaged areas of land causing a further public health threat.</p> <p>We are taking all necessary steps to keep maintenance staff safe by considering the health advisories and recommendations by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention. Practices such as social distancing, staggering staff work hours, mandatory glove wearing and sanitizing of hand tools are just some of the maintenance adjustments that the golf industry is proactively instituting. All day and evening cars race by our property (with no where to go) turn around at the park gate and race back, ignoring the speed limit. COVID-19	<p>You know me from our conversations at various public policy events, including the Stonewall Democrats of Pinellas County. I am however concerned that because our state officials are not taking similar measures, that the effectiveness of the Pinellas and Hillsborough County endeavors will be undermined. I urge you, along with the mayors of the cities in our area, to pressure the Governor to reconsider his meager measures.</p> <p>In the meantime however, I think that there is still a weakness at the county level. Perhaps I am unaware of all of the efforts, so with that caveat, I recommend the following:</p> <p>(1) Stronger enforcement by the County Sheriff including traffic stops to ask drivers the intent of their trip. Those who are travelling for purposes other than those allowed, should be denied the ability to proceed. Using police powers to require major grocery store operators to enforce social distance. I am appalled at the scenes inside the two supermarkets where I regularly shop: Publix and Aldi.</p> <p>(2) Closure of all small businesses that are truly not essential. Do book stores, barbers and clothing stores really need to operate? I think not. Closing these businesses for awhile benefits their employees and customers, and makes it less likely that the COVID 19 can be spread to you and me. ALL NON ESSENTIAL businesses should be closed.</p> <p>(3) A specific plan for all of the area hospitals to handle a surge in admissions in the coming weeks.</p> <p>(4) Consideration of using empty hotels and college dormitories for lower level COVID 19 patients to free up space in the hospitals.</p> <p>Finally I ask all of those on the County Commission to look closely at what is happening in Spain and Italy. The actions that those countries took three weeks ago have created their nightmare. This could be what we will experience in Mid-April.</p> <p>Thank you for your attention to my concerns. Beach and pool closures	I would like you to reconsider your policy of pool closings. I live at condo complex with 6 building, 179 units, 30 per building. This is our residence. This is not a hotel or public pool. We pay very high property taxes for our complex. Mine is around \$3,500 annually for 1800 square feet. Also included are the common areas, club house, pool and hot tub. Again this is our residence. 1/3 of owners have left as are snow birds. About 25 same people use the pool and hot tub. Others do not. This virus can not live in water and the sun helps kill it. I can see not using patio/lounge furniture in the wet area, but the water should not be shut down. For the past 2 weeks people have followed social distancing with chairs and when in the pool. You have shut down the beaches and LA fitness. I along with others use the water to treat my arthritic joints so I can walk which now is almost impossible without pain. Please reconsider pools in condo complexes that are privately owned and not a revolving rental property, Thank you and I welcome your comments back.
Beach and pool closures	I would like you to reconsider your policy of beach and pool closings. We moved to Florida to get away from the cold and snow of Minnesota. I understand spring breakers were gathering in large groups. They have since all left. As adults were are able to space ourselves 10 or more feet or remain in our family group, same as in our own homes with this stay in place order. From the media coverage sheriffs are patrolling the beaches for violators. You can not keep people out of the water to swim, play and cool off. Safer-at-Home Order	<p data-bbox="688 151 1217 180">Ms. Gerard and Mr. Eggers, (cc: Mr. Burton)</p> <p data-bbox="688 228 1964 258">I want to thank you as chair and vice chair of the board for advancing and passing the safer-at-home order.</p> <p data-bbox="688 306 2284 371">While the epidemiologists and virologists may lack enough data to reach complete consensus on some details, there does seem to be overwhelming concurrence by them that it is safer to stay at home when possible.</p> <p data-bbox="688 420 2292 487">You have crafted an emergency order that seems fair and balanced allowing businesses to operate and life to go on with the absolute minimum impact balanced against risks of exponential case growth.</p> <p data-bbox="688 535 2322 602">Having said this, I submit for your consideration a modification to the safer-at-home order in the event the local state of emergency and safer-at-home order are extended.</p> <p data-bbox="688 651 2300 717">This version of the order is light in compliance enforcement. This is just, proper, and appropriate. Minimum government intervention should always be the goal with the intent of private citizenry and businesses doing the "right" thing.</p> <p data-bbox="688 766 2308 911">Accordingly, the next version should include escalation enforcement powers. While non-essential businesses can be shut down, there are also some "bad actor" essential businesses who do not invest the effort to comply with CDC guidelines - or encourage/enforce that compliance by their customers in their businesses. I have no doubt the Sheriff can provide a list of businesses for which complaints have been received.</p> <p data-bbox="688 959 2322 1182">No one wants any business to be shut down. So perhaps the proper "escalation" is that if a business (including essential businesses) refuses or fails to follow CDC and/or FL DOH guidelines, the business can remain open - yet be required to pay the Sheriff's office for on-site crowd control and oversight. Obviously, the county attorney and Sheriff would need consulted, but as officers provide Sunday traffic control for places of worship (in normal times!) mechanisms exist for payment by businesses to the Sheriff for this labor. It seems if all businesses knew they had a financial stake - beyond the unlikely to be exercised complete and total shutdown - this would encourage the indifferent businesses to protect their bottom line.</p>
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Let Residents Back on Our Beaches in April	<p>I am a lifelong Pinellas county resident. I've been a homeowner in Largo for over ten years and frequent IRB (at least I used to). I can understand closing down public parking lots at beaches during spring break season to discourage tourists, but boarding up walk up beach accesses to locals? Check out the boardwalks at IRB, the measure taken were extreme. The only ones enjoying the beaches besides private residents are the tourists staying at beachfront hotels. Keeping beachfront hotels open may be to keep revenue and jobs, but the main goal should be to keep Coronavirus out. The ones who are actually spreading it are still on the beaches. Please take measures to prevent beachfront hotels from catering to tourists from hot spots like NYC (which has 2/3 of the nation's virus cases). These tourists are grouping on our beaches while local residents are shut out. Many New Yorkers could care less about quarantine. The locals your council banned off the beaches were taking personal responsibility. Locals stayed 6 feet apart and were in small family groups. I saw proper social distancing firsthand many times during this crisis while at Madeira Beach, Indian Rocks Beach and Sand Key. There were no issues with locals which is why the Pinellas County sheriffs opposed your decision to close the beaches to us. At most the council could have closed public parking and those beach accesses, and only if you were going to address the real issue first of beachfront hotels catering to people who could very well be spreading the virus to our community. There are many voters like me who witness tourists enjoying our beaches while we are kept out with wooden barricades. In April, reopen beaches to local residents and in the meantime address the real problem of tourists from NYC who are currently gathering at our local beachfront hotels.</p>
Closing of condominium pools	<p>The CDC website states that Covid 19 does not survive in swimming pools. Social Distancing in condominiums can be accommodated by limiting the number of chairs or people at the pool. coronavirus containment	<p>Commissioner,</p> <p>The current version of the Stay-At-Home order gives Pinellas County businesses the option to either close and stay at home, or comply with social distancing in accordance with CDC rules. However the choice at present belongs solely to the business owner and does not give any opportunity to the employee to choose the safer at home option. When the employer decides to stay open, the employee must choose between showing up to work, or being terminated for not doing so.</p> <p>A temporary resolution which offers protection from discipline for workers who decide in their own best interests and for that of the community to stay at home, rather than go to work for an employer who decides for his interests to stay open, is I believe and essential next step in containing the Coronavirus. This would be something similar to the protections of FMLA.</p> <p>Like FMLA, an employee who chooses to stay home when his employer is open for business would do so without pay, and not be eligible for unemployment compensation, etc. So this proposal would not further burden the unemployment system. It would only protect the employee from termination or other discipline for taking the very action we are encouraging people to do, and that is stay at home when possible.</p> <p>We write to you from a certain major defense contractor in central Pinellas who at present is exempt from closure and CDC compliance due to being deemed essential business. Our greater mission may arguably be essential for national security, but the reality is that at present our product is not even shipping out the door. The shipping companies have closed. Our suppliers have stopped supplying material to build with. Our presence here is of very little benefit and we feel we are all being put at risk unnecessarily. 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<p>Safer at Home Order & Associated Reference Materials with respect to Pawn Shops designation</p>	<p>Good morning,</p> <p>We appreciate the work of our local government and support flattening the curve. However, we have grave concerns over the specific exclusion of pawn shops from the essential list of financial services in the summary images provided to help citizens identify essential businesses. The exclusion of pawn shops shown on the reference materials is not stated anywhere in the county order.</p> <p>Many of our customers have no where else to turn in times of financial hardship. We are a lifeline to many in the community who are unbanked and underbanked.</p> <p>Further, we hope the county commissioners realize that Pawnbrokers are “Financial Institutions” under Federal Law. (See 31 U.S.C.A. § 5312(a)(2)(o); 15 U.S.C.A. § 6809; 12 U.S.C.A. § 1843(k)(1)). Because pawnbrokers are “financial institutions,” our stores and services are part of the nation’s critical infrastructure under 42 U.S.C. 5195c(e), the recent Presidential Policy Directive 21 (PPD-21), and the Department of Homeland Security on March 19, 2020 designated our employees as essential critical infrastructure workers under DHS’ Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (“CISA”) Memorandum on Identification of Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers During COVID-19 Response.</p> <p>On March 16, 2020, the President of the United States issued guidance regarding workers in the critical infrastructure industry stating that they have “a special responsibility” to maintain a normal work schedule.</p> <p>We respectfully request our local leaders remove this exclusion from the summarized listings. To be clear, for weeks we have followed CDC guidelines on sanitation and social distancing. All the elderly are stuck sheltering at home. I'm sure if they felt comfortable enough to come there would be a very lively debate.</p> <p>2) Most people here ARE following the shelter in place rule. While there are those in New York City that aren't, the amount of stress that the government has placed on washing your hands and not making contact with people has sunk in for most people. And that point was further driven home when we were placed on lockdown. Those that weren't taking it seriously at first realized at that point that it is indeed a serious issue and finally began to comply more.</p> <p>3) And most importantly, before the county makes any kind of decision, the most important thing to do is to look at the data we already have from countries that have been affected the most. Italian cities were given the authority to decide when to shut down and what measures to take. And for those that took measures early, their curve was flattened exponentially more than those that didn't. In addition, South Korea decided to test everyone, not just those who presented with symptoms. I know that logistically they're scrambling to make testing more available in Florida. But every time I see a lawmaker or a business owner say that there are only a handful of cases here or there, and that businesses still need to be open to make money, I cringe inside. The more people we test the more accurate our numbers will be. I am seriously concerned for the amount of damage that the spring breakers have done, and I'm very concerned for the amount of elderly who still go to the grocery store to get supplies. It is absolutely essential to take whatever proactive measures we can to stop the spread of disease. Because the numbers and the data from Italy, China, and South Korea don't lie. The cities that were proactive in flattening the curve saw vastly lower levels of mortality rates than those that didn't. My husband’s sister and his three nieces- and god daughters- cannot meet their new cousin in the hospital like we pictured. My husband is at least permitted to attend my appointments with me, as I am high risk and I have been diagnosed with gestational hypertension which has attacked my liver. My doctor is fantastic- but honest. He told me that I must isolate to protect both my baby’s life and my own. He told me we can treat my hypertension. That causes your debris to blow back in your face. Hazards of dumping?</p> <p>The heavy equipment operator started driving back and forth over previously dumped construction debris about 20' behind our truck while we tried to unload. The dust from the drywall, insulation and dirt was blowing directly in our face. Heavy toxic unbreathable dust.</p> <p>After the loader made several passes we got back into our truck to wait him out. The employee that was directing traffic got out of his a/c on, windows up truck and told us to leave or unload. We complained about the dust and he said leave or unload. We asked that the loader operator wait till we were done and he said "he's just doing his job". He continued his passes the entire time we unloaded. Total about 20 min.</p> <p>Breathing toxic construction dust is a health hazard for everyone. I have had heavy lung congestion since the episode. If the two employees were "doing their jobs" then I suggest they are poorly trained and supervised.</p> <p>The unloading at the landfill should be staged so that the wind is blowing away from your customers, repositioned as conditions change, or at least moved up and down a line to mitigate exposure.</p>

COVID-19 County Response	<p>Good Morning,</p> <p>I realize you have a lot on your plate and will not waste your time. Please make every effort to actively inform the public why social distancing is important (that is missing from the narrative) and how it can save our county and state. Any measures you believe may be extreme are not and are in fact the correct response.</p> <p>The following information is based on statistical data:</p> <p>There are 4 KNOWN cases in Pinellas right now, that means according to the numbers there are about 40 unreported cases of COVID-19 today.</p> <p>"The infection rate of the virus doubles every 3 days. In thirty days there will be 1,024 times the number of infected people in your area as there is today if your community does not immediately put social distancing into practice. One thousand and twenty four times as many infected people as there is today, in just 30 days."</p> <p>That means in Pinellas, in 30 days there will be 40,960 cases. Of those, an estimated 15% will require hospitalization. That's 6,144 people. In all of Pinellas there are 4,336 hospital beds, meaning we are 1,808 short. That's bad but if each hospital on average only has 1-2 ventilators the situation is much worse as a lot of those people will not get the care they need.</p> <p>HOWEVER (bright side) if the county helps the public understand and enforces strict social distancing by March 23 we can reduce this number to 2 to the 4th power. In essence, our 30 day outlook is 640 people infected, and of those only 15% or 96 would be severe. This is more manageable for our hospitals and for our long term health and economy. Closing the beaches, taking more aggressive measures and communicating "the why" to the public will be ultimately good for the health AND economy of the community. The quicker we do this, the quicker businesses, schools, etc can open back up. Pawnshops are an Essential Business. Regardless of your personal opinion of the industry. I wanted to make sure our community can continue to have access to much needed funds during this time of possible shutdowns. There is a lot of talk of people not working and needing access to cash, in addition to only keeping open essential businesses.

In addition, Pawnshops are storing items belonging to their clients. If those clients are in need of their items, then the pawnshop being closed prevents the client from being able to retrieve their own items. This is one of our biggest fears.

Our industry (pawnshops), serve a very large portion of all Pinellas County Communities that do not have access to bank accounts, credit cards, savings, or loans. Very simply; should Pinellas County start mandatory business closures, we ask that pawnshops be grouped together into a category of necessary businesses to remain open. Our customers have zero access to traditional banking institutions, especially during a time of large spread unemployment.

Congress has designated pawnbrokers as "financial institutions" in two major pieces of legislation. First, the USA PATRIOT Act, enacted in October 2001, defines "financial institution" to include pawnbrokers is codified at 31 U.S.C. § 5312(a)(2)(o). Providers of financial services in the scope of section 5312(a)(2) also include commercial banks and credit unions, among others.

Second, section 103 of the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Financial Services Modernization Act of 1999 and are subject to its Title V (Privacy), which governs providers of consumer financial services and to the two federal consumer financial protection regulations that implement Title V. This term also covers banks and credit unions, as do the regulations.

That being said, the Federal government considers Pawnshops as "Financial Institutions" as we provide essential, safety-net credit to tens of millions of Americans each year. We are regulated locally, at the state level, and at the federal level by consumer financial protection statutes, the federal Bank Secrecy Act, USA

Dear Commissioner Janet Long,

Now more than ever it is apparent how important housing is to our society. Despite current shelter in place orders in the Bay Area, the San Francisco mayor recently acknowledged that home construction is an essential service and is exempt from the shelter-in-place order. During these uncertain times, the housing industry not only provides a much-needed product for our customers, but many trades and industry professionals rely on us for their weekly income. We continue to receive calls from many trade partners requesting we do not stop work so that they can take care of their employees who in turn can support their families.

While we are all grappling with how to direct our teams in the best interest of their health balanced with the critical needs for the people of Florida, one message remains consistent across most jurisdictions: essential services, such as residential construction, must remain available. Many families need their new homes to be ready on time. They are often under contract to close on their previous residence, have an expiring lease or are temporarily living in combined households. If the new home pipeline is disrupted or shutdown, even briefly, the impact could be drastic. If families are left homeless during a quarantine, there may be equally problematic issues.

If permitting, inspections, deed recording, and other transaction services are disrupted by agency or municipality shutdowns, housing deliveries will be delayed. All of these items can be accomplished within Federal Government guidelines for health safety with social distancing and in many cases without any interpersonal interaction. D.R. Horton has already instituted best practices for field construction and professional work in compliance with recently recommended OSHA standards specific to COVID-19.

We ask that you immediately require:
