Testing Population

A total of 75 people were tested, 61.3% of whom were black (Table 1) and 86.7% were non-Hispanic.

The median age of those who received testing was 64 years old (range: 17, 86).




Figure 2. Resident zip codes of those tested at Childs Park event Figure 3. Self-reported symptoms as percent of total tested

75% of those tested reside in zip codes 33711 (29%), 33712 (28%), 33705 (11%), and 33707 (7%), the four zip codes in south Pinellas County nearest Childs Park (Fig 1, 2). The remaining 25% of people tested came from fourteen other zip codes, with between 1 and 4 residents from each.

Among those tested, the most common symptoms included dry cough (54%), SOB (33%), and productive cough (29%), while 8% were asymptomatic (Fig. 2).

Results

As of May 7, 2020, all results for the 75 specimens collected had been received. Of the 75 results received, one specimen has resulted positive (1.3%).
