


Purpose

Pinellas County Economic Development (PCED) fosters high-quality economic growth and vitality through the attraction, expansion, retention, and start-up of businesses that bring new money into the local economy through sales of most of their products or services outside the state of Florida. The Department helps expand the tax base through the capital investment of the businesses they assist. Their work also helps diversify the county's employment base beyond the traditional sectors of tourism and construction, bringing more economic stability during economic downturns, natural disasters, or pandemics. PCED offers investment tools, connections to government contracting and purchasing, and business consulting to benefit companies large and small, while fostering a pro-business climate in Pinellas County through local, regional, and statewide partnerships. Beginning in FY21, PCED is also responsible for the operations of the Young-Rainey STAR Center, a business and industrial park that is home to over 1600 workers.









COVID-19 and Business Support




Since May 2020, Pinellas County has experienced a faster unemployment recovery than State of Florida of average.

















STAR Center


The Young-Rainey Science Technology and Research (STAR) Center is owned and operated by the government of Pinellas County, Florida.

The STAR Center is located at the western gateway of Florida's High Tech Corridor and leases space to a diverse group of technology companies. It created a synergistic work environment in the areas of analytic and environmental testing, custom hybrid micro-electronics, circuit design and manufacturing, and forensic sciences among others.































Economic Development Incentive Grants
