

- Public/Pet Friendly or Special Needs shelter Transportation assistance is available



#### When Preparing Your Home for Hurricane Season Remember the ABC'S Anchor

- · Bring anything from the vard that could
  - become windborne · Replace gravel/ rock-landscaping with lightweight
  - mulch Trim and anchor down trees and foliage
- Brace
- · Bolt all doors with foot and head bolts
- Reinforce doors and tracks

- Cover large
- windows and doors with impact resistant shutters · Properly caulk or
- weather-strip all windows and doors Strap
- · Tie down any freestanding fixtures in your yard · Ask an installer
- about proper methods to secure sheds/carports
