Description & Comments

Three (3) municipalities are amending their Fire Protection Services Agreements to include additional capital items that were not included in the original agreements executed on September 24, 2019.

The City of Clearwater is adding a marine rescue unit with an estimated cost of \$75,000 on its capital replacement list for replacement in FY22. After applying the County's proportionate percentage of 11.36%, this will be an estimated cost of \$8,520 to the Clearwater unincorporated fire district.

The City of Seminole is adding a staff vehicle with an estimated cost of \$42,500 on its capital replacement list for replacement in FY22. After applying the County's proportionate percentage of 70.60%, this will be an estimated cost of \$30,005 to the Seminole unincorporated fire district.

The City of Tarpon Springs is adding Squad 69 to its replacement list in FY22. This fire apparatus will financed through a five (5) year lease-to-own program with an estimated annual payment of \$178,632. After applying the County's proportionate percentage of 9.36%, this will be an estimated annual cost of \$16,720 to the Tarpon Springs unincorporated fire district during the lease-to-own term.

These amendements and amounts are consistent with the request included in the FY22 Proposed Budget for the Fire Districts fund and multi-year financial forecast for each district.
