Development of the Plan



- Guidance from the Department of Treasury continues to develop and expand
- Departments submitted more than \$500 million of ideas
- Staff prepared criteria for recommendations
- Requesting policy direction from the Board for a vote on the initial and ongoing set of projects
- Staff will monitor and bring additional recommendations as projects are started and completed over the next five years

Decision Criteria



- Transformative long-term impacts
- Identified as a priority by the community
- Improves the health and/or economic outcomes of an underserved community
- Large-scale and visible

- Proposed by more than one department, jurisdiction, agency
- Avoids legacy costs
- Mitigates a County liability
- Aligns with County
 Strategic Plan objectives

Expenditure Categories



- Category 1 Public Health Projects
- Category 2 Negative Economic Impacts
- Category 3 Hard Hit Communities
- Category 5 Infrastructure
- Category 6 Revenue Replacement
- Category 7 Administration

Examples of Projects



- Category 1 Public Health Projects
 - Sheriff Mental Health Squad (\$1 million)
 - Human Services Software System (\$5.7 million)
 - Coordinated Access Model (\$1 million)
- Category 2 Negative Economic Impacts
 - Non-Profit Capital Projects (\$19 million)

Examples of Projects



- Category 3 Hard Hit Communities
 - Joe's Creek Greenway Trail and adjacent projects (\$3.161 million)
 - Raymond Neri Park Phases 1 and 1a (\$3.8 million)
 - Unincorporated Seminole Recreation Facility Funding (\$10 million)
- Category 5 Infrastructure
 - Palm Harbor Regional Storm Water System (\$3.6 million)
 - Septic to Sewer Project (\$10 million)

Examples of Projects



- Category 6 Revenue Replacement
 - Ridgecrest Gulf Terrace & Rainbow Village Infrastructure (\$200,000)
 - Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (\$500,000)
 - Regional Fire Training Center
- Category 7 Administrative Costs
 - Management, coordination, reporting, and compliance over five years (\$1.2 million)
