Discussion of the 2019 State Legislative Program & Priorities.

Recommended Action:

Board discussion and guidance on the 2019 State Legislative Program & Priorities.

- Annually, the Board develops a State Legislative Program & Priorities that is submitted to the Pinellas State Legislative Delegation.
- The Board’s 2019 State Legislative Priorities are the following:
 - 1.) File legislation which removes the requirement that the governmental building official appointments on the Pinellas County Construction Licensing Board (PCCLB) must reside in Pinellas County.
 - 2.) Support Regional transportation coordination and funding, specifically related to FDOT District 7
 - 3.) Support language that clarifies allowable uses for Tourist Development Tax funds.
 - 4.) Oppose efforts that would preempt local governments from controlling or managing Community Redevelopment Areas (CRA’s) as local economic development tools.
 - 5.) Support language that brings greater clarity to self-defense laws, including Stand Your Ground and Justifiable Use of Force.
- The overall State Legislative Program also identifies additional issues of interest to monitor, support, or oppose, as well as appropriations the Board will pursue.
