There are currently twelve (12) authorized wheelchair/stretchers transport providers in Pinellas County. This action would increase that number to fourteen (14) authorized providers. The two

added providers are considered under item 18-720A. This item renews the existing providers

If approved, the COPCNs will expire June 30, 2019.
